
The winner of this incredibly rare car was a gentleman whose father had one growing up. He had wanted one for ages, but could never find a



### Joe Penner and his Duck Goo Goo Toy Brings \$1,050 at Garnavillo Auction Company

Back to the show. A Milton Bradley 1920s flying machine in the box took off at \$225. A Tommy Ray Space Gun with box blasted a \$375 bid. A Steel Craft pressed steel NX130 toy airplane landed a \$450 bid while a Keystone pressed steel Airmail ride plane cruised to a \$425 bid. A set of three precision locomotives and tenders tracked a \$625 winning bid while a set of two precision locomotives with tenders chugged to a \$575 bid.

A Wooten-style burled walnut desk with full tambour roll closed at \$1,550. The double-wide stacker bookcase from Globe-Wernicke shelved a \$850 closing bid. Single stacker bookcases realized bids of \$475 and \$400 respectfully. A large Victorian mantel piece framed a \$975 bid. Display cases showed strong interest with a wood angled table top with two shelves settling at \$575 and a table case bringing \$160

Porcelain subway signs from the Staten Island NY Rapid Transit System directed bids of \$550, \$450 and \$225. A promotional poster for Fats Domino for a Cedar Rapids, Iowa performance danced to a \$550 sale.

Little Books brought big bids as did a series of art deco purses. Other bids of note: A Hamm's Beer 3-D calendar refreshed at \$140; A Jump-Spark Cigar Lighter lit a \$325 bid; A Victorian Urn with decorations brought \$525; A slag glass lamp with light-up base shined at \$300; an early 3-D zinc eagle with polychrome paint soared to \$600; a St. Drake bitter bottle brought \$200 while a Little Drummer's Boy Red Wing cookie jar held a \$250 bid. An early sled with battleship scene and swan's head slid to a \$325 sale while a LC Smith double-barrel shot gun fired to a \$775 bid.

## Rare Ralston-Purina's Space Patrol Coin-Op Ride Soars to \$37,950 at Donley Fall Classic Auction

When he stumbled upon Donley Auctions selling one, it must have felt like fate. Nothing could stop our determined buyer from getting the car as a tribute to his father. The room exploded into applause after the gentleman explained his story after winning the lot for \$16,500. He shared the wonderful story and ended with "[this] truly was my father's unicorn." There really is no bond like a family bond.

In addition to the Hupmobile, Donley Auctions had a few other interesting sales of the day including Lot #2169a, the Antique Automobile Tiedeman Trophy Plaque. This trophy is dated November 27, 1911, and was given by "The Tiedeman Trophy Cup Race" second prize. The cup was named after the then-mayor of Savannah, GA; George Tiedeman. The Tiedeman Trophy Cup Race was open to cars of less than 230 cubic inch displacement. Additionally, 1911 was the first year the Vanderbilt Cup Race was held outside of New York, which added to the hype. The race was run 2 days before the Vanderbilt Cup Race and only 6 cars competed. 2nd Place was awarded to Robert Evans, driving the #34 E-M-F 30 race car. The rare trophy sold

for \$6,900. Another highlight of the day included Lot #2212, a Western Electric 23-C W 618-B Input Transformers, which ended up selling for \$23,000. Lot #1167, the beautifully restored Royal coffee roaster, sold for \$4,830. The Formosa pedal rickshaw, Lot #2155, has a stunning set up with newly reupholstered cushions and cover, and sold for \$1265.

A wonderfully rare Ralston-Purina Space Patrol coin operated ride for children, Lot #1180, drew quite the attention as well. The first and only of its kind, the ride was halted in production before they could even make them. This single prototype is the sole copy of the only coin operated ride to have a corporate sponsor, Ralston-Purina. It came with a whole lot of licensed items from DVDs to a rare children's helmet. This rare opportunity garnered much interest and ultimately sold for \$37,950 to a very excited buyer.

> As a small boy, my husband Burnell, began a life-long fascination with Indian lore and artifacts. He spent his early years living with his parents and grandparents in the old farmhouse on his grandfather's farm.

> > As soon as he could walk through the plowed fields, his grandpa would take him arrowhead hunting in the early spring soon after the snow melted.

The farm was atop a hill on the edge of a beautiful valley with a creek winding through the low land. The best area to hunt and unearth these ancient artifacts

was the cow's "night pasture" after it had been fall plowed. Many times they would almost fill an old cigar box with the treasured finds.

On trips to Rice Lake, WI, he would listen to true stores his maternal great-grandmother would share from her life. She was 100% Ojibwa.

3,000 to 5,000 year old Copper Spud.

As life evolved, he purchased a farm about a mile from the "home farm" and tilled the land there uncovering many ancient pieces including a slate gorgette, a small stone axe along with many 31 graded Indian arrowheads, spears and fossils. game balls on specially

After we were married, we enjoyed ven-

turing to other areas to hunt. Our friends Dr. Paul Hughes and his wife Virginia were frequent hunting partners.

"A BIRTHDAY GIFT FROM THE PAST" was originally published in the January 1979 edition of the Archaeological Central States Journal. Permission to reprint in its entirety was given by the author.

On April 14, 1978, my husband Burnell and I and friends Paul and Virginia Hughes of Whitewater, WI, celebrated my birthday with lunch followed by our first surface hunt of the year on a field along the Rock River that

we hoped we would find to have been fall plowed. However, on arriving at the field, we found soybean stubble rather than a

plowed surface. Although disappointed, we decided to hunt the field anyway, since it was such a nice spring day.

My husband suggested that I walk along a dry wash which followed the edge of the field towards the river. After proceeding down and around the wash, I walked along the field where it bordered the river. Halfway to the end of the field, I saw what appeared to be a blue-green stone, but on picking it up, I realized it was a metal object. I called my husband and friends to see my find, which was identified as a copper spud.

Carefully wrapping it, we drove to the home of our friends, then soaked the spud in water to float away the dirt. We found it to be 2 inches deep and 2 inches wide. The spud has a fine hammered beveled edge on the inside at the bottom.

After arriving home, we visited Mr. and Mrs. Frank Squires of Burlington, WI to show them our find. Frank, a longtime friend and Indian artifact authority, advised us

of the upcoming archaeological meeting at Williams Bay and suggested that we show the copper piece. At the show the Badger State Archaeological Society awarded me a ribbon for Best Personal Find of 1978. The thrill of winning the ribbon was exceeded only by that which accompanied the finding of the copper artifact, my "birthday gift from the past."

Later, taking the spud to the archaeology experts at the Dixon Mounds in Illinois, addination of the second they confirmed it to be 3,000 to 5,000 years BC! This was a once in a lifetime experience for me. I gave this spud to my husband to display in his beloved collection.

Another of the pictured items that are part of this extensive collection is a large frame of 169 mounted arrowheads under glass. One especially noteworthy point is a mahogany obsidian one.

> There is a collection of 31 graded Indian game balls that range from largest to smallest on a specially made wooden display. Burnell did purchase the majority of these more than 35 years ago from one individual and then added some to it. Displayed all together in one spot is very impressive.

One of the items Burnell particularly enjoyed is the "The Cheyenne", a bronze sculpture copyright by Fredric Remington. He purchased this piece back in 1978 and it has been on display in our home since.

As the years progressed Burnell added to his collection wherever we traveled, whether it be out east or in the southwest. So, the collection that is coming up for auction has pieces from across our nation. Besides the items aforementioned, it includes beaded items, arrowheads and spear points made from chert, flint, maple jasper, agate, and obsidian and sugar quartz. There are wooden bows and arrows; various copper items; spears; needles; drift copper beaded bracelet; war club, etc. Many stone axes, some job specific ones such as an ice axe; pottery; an unusual Zing (wood and moss) Medicine man figural doll; glass trade beads; various fossils and natural stone formations; a large stone bowl w/pestle; Eskimo game pieces; knife; early small doll; knife; and more. Banded slate bird stone; gorgettes; original paintings which are Indian themed; photos of Indians; figural pipes; and many more Indian related are part of this huge collection amassed over 80 years and displayed proudly by my husband.

I hope that these special artifacts will bring as much pleasure to the purchasers as they did to us, through the years.






