



# 1883 Flop Griddle Brings \$1,100 at Simmons & Co. Auction

Husband, Jim shares, "I remember Donna's first piece was a small Lamb mold which I purchased from around here (St. Peters, MO) somewhere. It was for her birthday I believe. I had no idea at the time that it was going to be so addicting for her. She appreciated the beauty of the piece and the time and effort that went in to create. She admired it as though it were a piece of art. From that moment on, it was all about cast iron. It wasn't just collecting.... it became a treasure hunt. Between us it was a competition to see who could out do the other in finding the best piece. She would study the pieces to see the different markings each of their individual characteristics. She loved being a Griswold member and loved going to the conventions and showing off her pieces and learning from all of the knowledgeable people in the club. She started a website all by herself! She bought books and created everything from scratch. All she wanted to ever do was teach people about the cast iron which she so deeply loved and to get newbie's as she would call them interested in collecting like she was so passionate about." Donna was passionate about her beloved cast iron pieces and I know that having them go to another collector who will love and appreciate them as she did would greatly please her.

favorite color was red, so in the mid-sixties he began collecting ruby red glassware. When he could no longer find unusual pieces, he decided to collect Griswold cast iron because the name was spelled exactly the same as his last name. About once a month the family would load in the car and travel to the Heart Drive In, the 63rd Street Drive In, and Westport Flea Market in Kansas City. He also attended the flea market in White Cloud, Kansas several times. Some Sundays, the family would go for a drive and stop at every antique shop on the route. His was a master at bartering with the sellers for that bargain price. The first piece of Griswold was a #8 skillet given as a wedding present from his parents in 1950. His favorite Griswold piece was the #13 skillet. During all of the years of collecting Griswold cast iron, Park wondered if he was related to the owners of Griswold Manufacturing Co. In 2010, an online search discovered (and verified) that Park's ancestor, Michael Griswold, was a first cousin to Matthew Griswold, the founder of Griswold Manufacturing Co. Dad loved his collection and proudly displayed them for any visitor to delight in. The family hopes that the pieces you purchase will bring you as much joy as they did for him." Simmons & Co. # **Antiques Abbreviations**

A while ago a reader asked about explaining some of the abbreviations they encounter in auction ads. This got me thinking about the abbreviations auctioneers use and why we use them. After a phone call to Gloria I offered to put together a listing.

By definition, an abbreviation is a shortened form of a word or phrase used for brevity. Within context and reason it identifies certain aspects of a piece to the buyer without needlessly going into detail. A lamp buyer will know what a "bracket lamp" is. It's unnecessary to say, "Victorian cast iron wall bracket with mercury glass reflector, chimney & drop in finger font". Most auctioneers use abbreviations in order to keep the size of the ad affordable. However it can be too much of a good thing and some of the more arcane descriptions can confuse or mislead the reader. To a person who collects a particular category most abbreviations in that category are readily recognized. To anybody else they are probably gibberish. Even a novice farm toy buyer won't need a three day weekend to decipher IH, McD & JD. WWI & WWII are obvious but would most folks recognize CW (Civil War) out of context? Coins, firearms, Hummels (152/A TMK3 UB K255 HB, anyone?) and other categories all have their own abbreviations that often are exclusive to that field. But if you are a glassware buyer does it really matter if you can't translate a 28g, o/u, d-bbl, ss w/syn stock and vr?

Some descriptions, while not technically correct, get the point across. For example "Jewel T', (which is short for Jewel Tea, a grocery chain) takes up less space than "Autumn Leaf", (a pattern name for china offered as a premium by Jewel Tea). This may seem like a trivial difference but similar descriptions over several publications begin to add up.

A listing that encompassed all of the collecting fields would be more of a project than I can take on but the following abbreviations should get you through most ads for antique auctions. If you have others you'd like to add to the list or that you've wondered about, please email them to me at mike@paulauction.com.

A&C - Arts & Crafts. Refers to the style of furniture usually associated with early 1900s Stickley. Often but erroneously referred to as Mission or Prairie.

ABC - American Brilliant Cut. Refers to the "Brilliant" period of late 19th/early 20th century American cut glass

B&H – Bradley & Hubbard. A manufacturer of quality lighting and decorative accessories

B&W – Blue & White. The glaze colors used on utilitarian stoneware that was often found in the kitchen.

CI - Cast Iron.

COP – Century Of Progress. Typically refers to souvenirs hauled back from the Chicago World's Fair of 1933/34. Even in the middle of the Great Depression, a lot of Wisconsinites made the trip to see the COP.

CRS - Somebody explained this to me once, but I can't seem to remember what they said.

Dmg - Damage.

gl - Gallon. Typically used when advertising stoneware capacity

For Rest - For Restoration. Don't go to the auction expecting a cream puff.

GBCF - Glass Ball Claw Foot. Describes the foot usually found on late Victorian parlor and lamp tables.

GWTW - Gone With The Wind. A style of lamp with a matching font and top globe. Correctly referred to as a parlor lamp but popularly known as a Gone With The Wind, after the movie of the same name.

LRRH- Little Red Riding Hood. Typically refers to the Regal China products that feature her.

MIB - Mint In Box. Any item, but often a toy, that is in the same condition as new and in the original box.

MOP - Mother of Pearl. Polished nacre usually derived from mollusk shells. Typically found in jewelry, ladies dresser articles, buttons and in the windows of RPOG art.

NIB - New In Box. Similar to above but often assumed to be of modern production NOS - New Old Stock. Old merchandise, often with original manufacturer's tags and merchant's price tags, that has never been sold or used.

NWOT - New With Original Tags, but sometimes used as New With Out Tags. eBay sellers are usually guilty of using this both ways. If buying online, clarify before bidding.

o/b - Outboard. An outboard motor.

OOB - Oil on Board. Art work done on a board, usually Masonite.

OOC - Oil on Canvas. Art work done on canvas.

Pre Pro - Pre Prohibition, prior to 1920. Refers specifically to alcohol related advertising.

Post Pro - Post Prohibition, after 1933. Refers specifically to alcohol related advertising.

QA - Queen Anne. Generally refers to a 1920's or 30's revival style exemplified by a cabriole leg.

Repro - Reproduction. A good definition would require a separate article but you get the idea. Occasionally people will use the slang "Repop" for repro or "Repo" which is inaccurate and what happens to your car when Vinnie pulls up in a tow truck.

RPOG - Reverse Painted on Glass. Less common as ROG. Any item where the design or artwork has been applied to the obverse side of the glass but typically a lamp shade, decorative framed art or advertising items.

RPPC – Real Photo Post Card. Differentiates a post card that was printed, (developed) off your film from one that was commercially printed. These were so popular that Kodak marketed the 3A folder specifically for the RPPC.

RR – Railroad.

RW – Red Wing. Red Wing, or less often, the several other stoneware companies that called Red Wing, MN their home.


/s/ - Signed.

s/g - Salt Glaze. Refers to the type of glaze used on stoneware and to differentiate it from the later, more common, zinc glaze.

TOC - Tin Over Cardboard. A type of sign made of tin wrapped over a piece of paperboard and hung by a piece of short thread mounted to the back side of the sign. Commonly used in the 1930's and 40's by brewing and other industries.

T&S- Time & Strike. Refers to clock movements. Differentiates between time only and striking movements.





# Items arrive right up to & sometimes during the auction!

You never know what you're going to find at Greg Klug's Monthly Antique, Art & Collectible Auction!

You may have seen the auction and picker programs on television, but the Klug family has lived it for over 1/2 century making them one of the oldest & more experienced Antique & Estate liquidators in Wisconsin. Greg has personally traveled around picking & settling estates, and appraising in all but a few states in the USA. I have also picked in a few other countries over the past 38 years, and so has my father, siblings, 2 uncles and a few cousins as well.

The monthly auction held at the Jefferson County Fair Park in Jefferson Wisconsin has been the venue for Major Wisconsin Auctions for decades since it out grew the facility in Palmyra and is known for a large selection of antique & vintage furniture, art and other desirable and interesting items.

Being a family run auction for 55 years there are many stories to be shared, but the most important is in any given day no matter if 500 items or 2,000 "The job gets done & everyone gets paid" in an honest and direct manner.

Hard to find items just show up the night before or morning of the regular monthly auction unannounced & of course unadvertised. Bidders have witnessed record prices as well as bargains, you just never know. 

# **Prices Strong at Rich Penn's 2 Day November Auction** in Des Moines, Iowa

Sunday's session was nearly all Drug Store related. That session was jammed with advertising, apothecary jars and bottles, show globes in every shape and style, candy jars, straw dispensers, Coca-Cola items, syrup dispensers, ice cream dippers and a variety of apothecary tools and equipment. For the collectors of Drug Store related items...there were many rare pieces that you never see come to auction. And prices reflected that.

The highlights of the Saturday session were dominated by another strong showing for petroliana and coin-operated machines. The top lot on Saturday went to petroliana. An excellent condition 48" dia double- sided porcelain sign for Deep Rock Gas & Motor Oil encouraged bidders to dig deep in their pockets. It went to a very happy bidder for \$7,500. All prices are hammer prices do not include the 10%-20% buyers premium. The next two top lots were both jukeboxes. According to Penn, "Coin-operated machines are starting to see strength again. These two machines are good examples." A very nice c.1947 Wurlitzer 1015, the classic "Bubbler" with an older restoration, played to a nice tune of \$6,500. A companion machine, the c.1939 AMI Singing Towers made a strong performance as well. This machine is another classic, due to it's "Sky Scraper" Art Deco design. Even though the machine needed restoration and some mechanical attention, it still sang well enough to get a \$6,000 top bid. The machine is on it's way to Europe.

Other top lots include a 6" x 24" porcelain Texaco No Smoking sign selling at \$3,900 and a Mobiloil Gargoyle oval milk glass globe selling at \$3,500. Another great advertising piece that went to Europe was the National Mazda Lamp display. Selling at \$2,750, it will light up a collection in France!

Other coin-operated machines selling well were three Jennings light-up Club Chief slots in a floor cabinets, a 5c, 50c and 25c version, selling at \$2,100, \$2,000 and \$1,800 respectively. A rare King Equip, "King" three reel slot sold at \$1,900.

Other lots selling at \$1,900 were a cigar cutter & lighter for Fidler's El Rocco 5 cent cigar, a Mobiloil "A" rack with 8 Gargoyle qt. bottles, and a Wrigley's Gum trade

stimulator. A Winchester .22 cal short model 1873 rifle, blasted out a high bid of \$1,500 while a .32 cal hit \$1,300. A lot of 6 Lionel 0 gauge trains rolled to a high bid of \$1,600 and a reverse paint on glass light-up sign for Mother's Best Flour cooked up a bid of \$1,200.

The Sunday session of the auction was indeed a prescription for fun. Almost entirely from the collection of the late Ron Shear, his taste in apothecary items proved to be exceptional. Three of the top lots in the Sunday session all hammered down at \$6,000 each. They included the two most elaborate stacking 3 section show jars, 40" and 46" tall, and an excellent condition figural Bromo Seltzer 45" tall porcelain 1/2 bottle shaped sign.

Three other lots hit the \$3,750 price mark. They included a c.1970 Coca-Cola ceramic urn syrup dispenser, a very rare rotating candy jar display with 5 Bunte jars that tipped down to dispense candy and another stacking 3 section show jar. An Edison Triumph cylinder record player, with cabinet and wood cygnet horn played to a \$2,250 top bid. A striking druggist apothecary compounding station, in ash or oak, with etched crackle glass took a top bid of \$2,000. The largest piece to sell at the auction was a charming metal 2-sided revolving drug store trade sign. The sign came from a drug store in St. Paul, MN and was in as found condition. With missing neon, but flashing lights that surrounded the signs perimeter, it revolved and flashed it's way to a new home for \$1,600.

Penn commented, "This was an exceptional auction. The Shear's Family was here and I think it's fair to say they were amazed. We were too. Serious bidders were here and prices were strong. The late Ron Shear II had a lot of rare pieces and other collectors were ready and willing to buy. Mrs. Shear was happy when she left, so was son Ron III and that's what we're here for. 
