



Several Local Estates Make for One Great Auction at Beloit Auction's November 28th Sale

You never know quite what you'll find at Beloit Auction & Realty's weekly Wednesday consignment auctions. One week might feature contemporary furnishings and late model cars, the next fine art and estate jewelry. At their November 28th sale, there was a great mix of antique & vintage furniture, firearms from early to modern, plus collections of Depression glass, brassware, and more.

But of course the star of the sale was that 1965 Austin-Healey 3000 Mark III convertible. The British sports car maker introduced the 3000 series in 1959, replacing the Austin-Healey 100. The 3000 Mark III was launched in October 1963, and remained in production until the end of 1967, when production of Austin-Healeys ceased. In that five-year span, around 17,000 "3000s" were made. This example couldn't be described as anything but very rough, and was partly disassembled, but collectors from several states bidding on the classic two-seater drove the price to a surprising \$12,300.

The evening's other classic car was very different: a near-original condition 1949 Dodge Coronet. No, not the 1960s "muscle car" Coronet that was Dodge's version of the Plymouth Road Runner. This 1949 Coronet was one of the first post-WWII Dodge designs, a chunky four-door sedan with a 103hp straight-six motor. Interestingly, it also came standard with the three-speed Gyromatic fluid transmis-

sion, explaining the lack of any shifter on the car. It sold for a very reasonable \$2,000. A clean & running Ford 7000 tractor did exactly twice as well, crossing the block at an even \$4,000.

All of the 300-plus lots were on their way home with new owners within a few hours, thanks to the efficient Beloit Auction staff. On the way out, bidders got a chance to preview items from a fabulous area estate to be auctioned on January 30th right here at the Beloit Auction Gallery. Stop by and take a look if you get a chance.





Over the course of three days hundreds of bidders from around the world converged into the RIAC auction hall for a chance to own one of the many important pieces that were offered throughout the weekend. Additionally, thousands of phone bidders were called from across the globe, and over 13,000 sealed bids were placed before the first drop of the hammer. The anticipation

could be felt in the air throughout the weekend as eager collectors and curious spectators watched firearms from a number of world class collections cross the auction block. A few of the major genres that held the spotlight were Winchesters, Sharps, Walther, Mauser, Smith & Wesson, Remington and Colt. The Ulrich Family Factory Engraved Winchester Rifles accounted for the top three lots each selling for over \$100,000 each. A John Ulrich Factory Panel Scene Engraved Gold Inlaid Winchester Model 1894 Deluxe Factory Takedown (Lot 1001) brought \$115,000. While a Gold Plated Relief Engraved Winchester Model 1866 Carbine Factory Engraved by his brother Conrad F.

Ulrich also brought \$115,000 (Lot 3001). Other notable

Winchester's include a Fine Early Production Model 1866

Saddle Ring Carbine with Henry Patent Barrel Address (Lot 3009) which brought \$63,250, and a special order Winchester Model 1886 in 50 Express (Lot 1004) achieved \$48,875. 

Arts Group Publishes Guide to Northwest Wisconsin Arts, Growers, Heritage

In the small towns, villages and along the rustic roads of northwestern Wisconsin are some of the state's most valuable assets: creative human beings who nurture beauty, value nature and share their heritage through places, objects and edibles that are handmade and homegrown.

Now there's a brand hew paperback guidebook published by the Wisconsin's Northwest Heritage Passage:: 208 pages that shine a light on these places and people who live and work along and around the Highway 63 corridor in 13 northwest Wisconsin counties.

It's called The Wisconsin Passage: an Adventure in the Handmade, Homegrown and Historical Offerings of Wisconsin from the Mississippi River to the Lake Superior, or simply, The Wisconsin Passage. The book is the culmination of a dream that began 12 years ago when a group of northwest Wisconsin people like Spooner weaver Alene Peterson realized that the cottage industries of working crafters, artists, growers were key to a sustainable "creative economy" in this region.

Peterson and a committee of five - all volunteers -- began by establishing a set of criteria. "We were looking for locally made or grown items, quality products, interesting destinations, environmental responsibility, openness to the public, and safety," said Peterson.

Each of the 350 listees in the book submitted written descriptions of their studios, galleries, farms, museums, and other arts, agricultures or culture-related businesses. Committee members visited each site, providing feedback about their experiences. Others collected and worked with submitted images or took photographs themselves.

Janet Krokson of Spooner was the book committee's muse who gathered the descriptions, historical facts, anecdotes, and other materials, weaving them into a narrative that makes the book an entertaining read as much as a travel guide.

Editor of the Spooner Advocate and life-long resident of the area, Krokson said, "It was a labor of love. I've lived in Highway 63 communities for the past 31 years," she said. "I love Wisconsin, and I particularly love this part of the state."

She continued, "I think of The Wisconsin Passage as a passage to more passages - to bygone days, to an adventure that anyone can take part in. It's about artists, artisans, performers, nature lovers, natural growers, pioneer settlers and storytellers of many genres who forged a life and culture along the heritage roads and trails."

Peterson added, "We want this book to bring the public together with artists and growers where they live and work and showcase those hometowns, villages and farms as well as the natural beauty of northwest Wisconsin destinations for travelers of all ages,"

The WNHP was founded in 1999 as an arts support group dedicated to supporting, showcasing and educating the public about the talents and creativity of northwest Wisconsin's communities. In 2001, 2004 and 2009, WHNP published and distributed more than 100,000 foldout maps listing handmade, homegrown and heritage sites. The Wisconsin Passage replaces those maps as a more permanent testament to the thriving creative economy in northwest Wisconsin.

There is no commercial advertising in the book. Production was funded by memberships, in kind and cash donations from businesses and private citizens through "Friends of the Passage." Proceeds from sales of the book will be used to update and publish future editions.

Following the initial book launch on August 27 at Northwind Book & Fiber in Spooner, additional launches are planned in each of the 13 counties in the coming months. The Wisconsin Passage may be purchased at Northwind Book & Fiber, 205 Walnut Street, Spooner, and online at www.heritagepassage.com, where there will be a list of other retail outlets selling the book. 


