The Northern Illinois Antiques Dealers Association presented their 53rd Annual Antiques Show on February 16th & 17th at the Forest Hills Lodge in Rockford, Illinois. An eclectic mix of around forty dealers displayed everything from period fine art to vintage sporting collectibles, with an emphasis on country Americana. 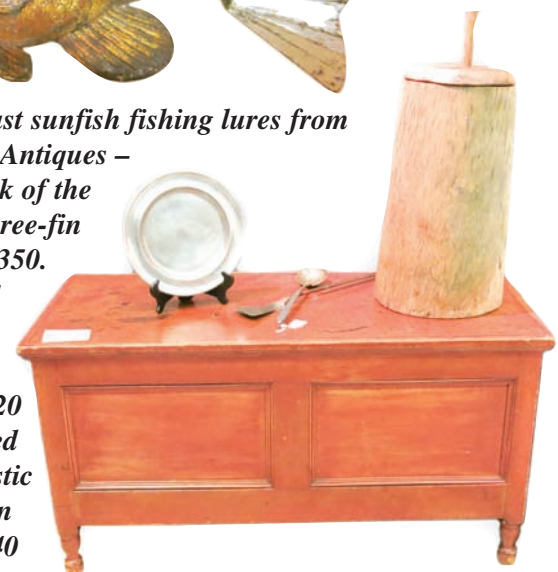

The Northern Illinois Antiques Dealers Association Show: A Rockford Tradition for Fifty-Three Years

The NIADA Antiques Show was the very first show I covered for this newspaper - way back in 2003. It's still one of my favorites, with a flavor different from any other show I've attended. Perhaps the more intimate scale of the show has something to do with it. Or maybe it's the unique mix of dealers, many of who are longtime NIADA members.

Forest Hills Lodge hosted this fifty-third edition of the NIADA show, as they have for more than twenty years. You couldn't ask for a better venue for the show. It's just off of I-90, on Route 173 at the northern edge of Rockford. Parking is free, and it's only a modest \$6.00 donation for show entry. Proceeds from the show, as always, are donated to several local non-profit historical associations.

I always find lots of outstanding 19th century American country furniture and accessories at the NIADA Show, and this year was no exception. And Cothren House Antiques is always a good place to start looking. An unusual Wisconsin-found red-washed country cupboard (\$1,395) was a highlight there, as was a small-but-nice group of Galena pottery.

The country furnishings theme continued at Acquired Taste Antiques, where I found painted pieces including an extra-rustic blind front corner cupboard in an old blue finish, price tag \$695. American Barn Antique Company had many fine choices too, among them an early New England step-back bucket bench, 4'-wide and priced at \$675.

Want something a little funkier? There were countless options all over the show. A hard-to-find 'Watermelon' cast iron hog oiler (\$1,100) at Jason E. Sword Antiques had great sculptural appeal. At K. Hill Antiques, a humongous folk art assemblage of vintage musical instruments (\$850) made quite a statement too, standing five feet tall.

And my favorite oddity of the show may have been the framed display of 1911 and 1912 dog show prize ribbons won by the purebred bulldog 'Champion Markham Tommy' - complete with a photographic portrait of Tommy himself and priced at \$1,250.

It's great pieces like that that have kept folks coming back to this show year after year. I hope the photos give you a taste of what the NIADA Antique Show has to offer. Be sure to pencil in February 15th & 16th of 2014 and come out for the 54th edition of the Show. 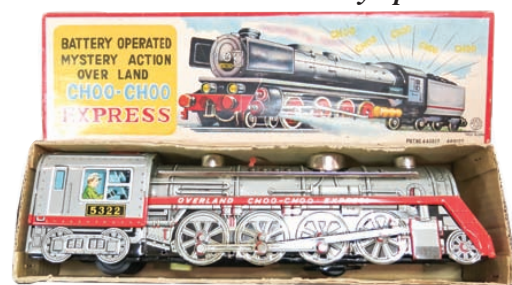

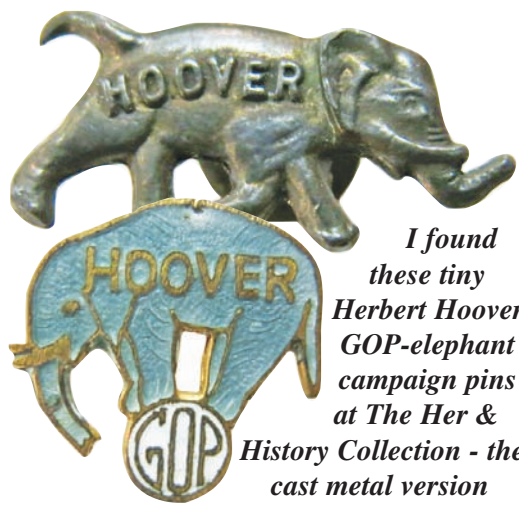

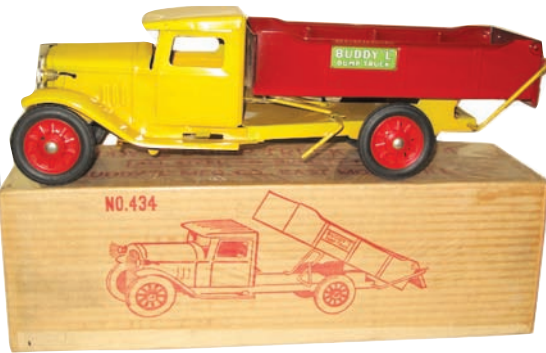

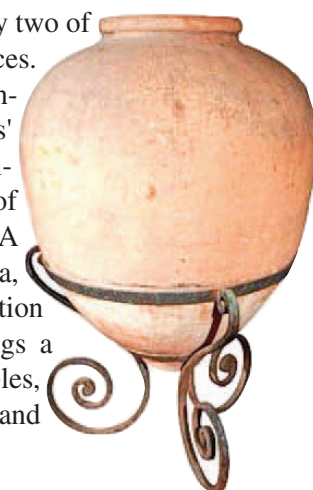
