

Spring Edition a Big Success for Tuscola, Illinois' Rural Life Antique Show & Sale

Tuscola, Illinois is a quintessential Midwestern town, home to around 4,500 folks and the seat of Douglas County. The imposing Douglas County Courthouse dominates the town center, but the area is known much better for something: its large and growing Amish community, founded in the 1860s and now numbering more than 4,500 strong. A significant tourism business has grown right along with them too, with dozens of shops selling Amish-made products ranging from rustic furniture to hand-made cheeses

As you might imagine, the picturesque area is natural location for country & primitives-oriented shows. The "A Gathering on the Prairie" show was the first of the now four antiques shows participating in the Illinois Amish Country Spring Antiques Weekend, and just celebrated its eleventh successful season. It and two other shows are located in Nearby Arthur, Illinois, with this Rural Life Antique Show & Sale just down the road in Tuscola.

Donna Kidwell, ably assisted by her husband Richard, founded the show in 2011. She's uniquely qualified for the task, having operated Tuscola's Winterberry antiques shop for a quarter of a century. "It's an exciting antiquing area, especially during the spring shows," Donna told me. "And with dealers coming from all over the country, you never know quite what will show up."

Michigan's Caulkin House Antiques was among those dealers. They brought classic Americana for every taste, from a painted-dial Silas Hoadley tall case clock to a Pennsylvania Moravian walnut work table. Douglas Solliday Antiques likewise had some nice furnishings - my favorite there an elegant American Sheraton figured maple chest of drawers, asking price \$2,200.

Kitchenalia more your thing? Well, look no farther than Iowa's Over Hill Over Dale Antiques. You'll find the rarest of early food gadgetry there, with examples at this spring show including a Rough Riders-themed coffee grinder and a hand-cranked twin malt mixer. And while the focus of the show is on country & primitive antiques, you'll find exhibitors specializing in everything from advertising to folk art to period lighting and more. The show was crowded from start to finish, with most every shopper I spoke to planning to visit all four area shows by the end of Saturday.

This Spring Illinois Amish Country Antiques Weekend was just the beginning of the region's 2013 events. May brings the Amish Country Quilt Show, followed by the venerable Moultrie-Douglas Combined County Fair in July. And tens of thousands of visitors come each Labor Day Weekend for the Amish Country Cheese Festival. You can visit www.illinoisamishcountry.com for all the details of those events and more. 





Kramer Auction Service Winter Firearms & Sporting Auction Attracts More than 1,000 Bidders

British Sea Service Flintlock Model 1801 \$2,300.

No surprise for the #1 spot went to a fine & early (3 digit serial number) Henry rifle, always in demand this beauty shot to a hammer price plus premium of \$25,600. The next two spots, brass again; this time a fine Winchester 3rd Model 1866 rifle. After some spirited inhouse bidding it finally found a new home for \$8,800. Third spot another 1866 Winchester rifle, this time a later 4th model demanded \$6,825.

A Brass barreled European Flintlock Blunderbuss w/rare spring tooth bayonet was next at \$4,125. The 1st modern gun to crack the top 10 was an Armalite AR-50, 50 cal

Bolt Rifle (NIB) selling at \$3,575 (lots of firepower for your money!) Another lever gun this time a Whitney Kennedy Carbine, with less than 1,000 mfg. this rarity was solid at \$3,350. Then a possibly one of a kind Indian Reservation Police double barrel started strong & shot to \$2,750 before stopping. WWII Guns broke into the mix with an original 1903-A4 sniper rifle, minus the scope still requiring \$2,760 to find a new home.

An 1873 Single Action Colt finished #9 for the day at \$2,420, this one mfg. in 1900 had a 7.5" bbl. & chambered in 38-40 cal.

Next was another Whitney Kennedy rifle, this one was a large frame in fair condition for \$2,420. Out of the top 10 but still notable was a Rare British Sea Service Flintlock Pistol, after lots of phone & internet bidding this early big bore made the trip back across the pond to its original home in England to an international bidder for a \$2,300 ticket.







The Asheford Institute of

Antiques (AIA), a professional-level, distance learning program on antiques and appraising, recently released the results of an in depth survey it conducted on market trends in the antique business, which it compiled from students and former graduates.

The primary focus of the survey was to gauge interest in current trends of antiques and collectibles, based on sales and requests for particular items. And while no measurable scientific practices were employed, and the survey was informal in nature, the

results were still quite interesting, said the schools publications Director, Tony Drew. "What we found was that there was a real generational shift in the marketplace, things that tended to "trend" upwards in a truly noticeable fashion, were much more the domain of younger buyers. Whereas items that seemed to have little or no Internet "buzz," remained fairly stable in their position of relative interest to potential customers, and were more often purchased buy older buyers." In other words, said Drew, "Younger consumers seemed to be setting the trends as to what was hot and what was not – some what unusual occurrence in the world of antiques."

Don Kirpatrick, a 20-something dealer in the Northeast who participated in the school survey, said that while he still looks at everything when attending auctions for inventory, he now concentrates more heavily on items like Art Deco, and early primitives. "My clientele is primarily younger-hipster folks who want things from these periods, they're not looking for mid-Victorian pieces that are heavily decorated..." Staffers from the school who conducted the survey said this was a common theme they found when asking about what was selling. "Younger dealers had very different items and inventory when compared to older dealers," said Shirley Huey, one of the staffers who helped complete the survey, "Not only were they different in inventory, but in their marketing approaches as well."

Charles Green, current Director of the Institute, also noted that while 20 years ago most antiques stores often had a "little bit of everything," today's dealers tend to concentrate on items based on generational interest. "I think what we're finding, said Green, "is that bricks and mortar antique businesses are beginning to be more representative of what you see in online stores... a far greater degree of specialization is taking place, and the age of both the dealer and the customer seems to have something to do with that."

Green went on to stress that while the survey was by no means scientific, it still pointed out interesting trends within the today's antiques marketplace.






