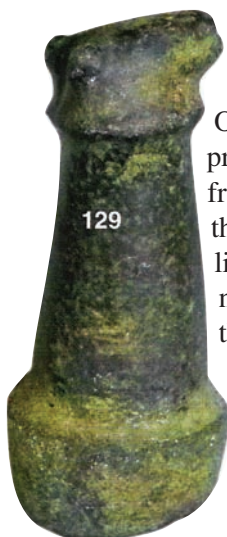

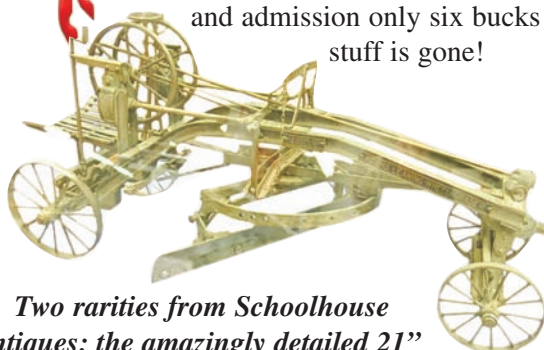

Minnesota's Antique Spectacular: Hundreds of Dealers - Two Days of Fun

Minnesota's Antique Spectacular was started by a group of nine antique dealers back in 1989: Rick & Sam Deloia, John & Tony Policano, Dan & Rick Reitzel, Lenny & Dave Piche, and Tom Johnson. They were having a hard time finding a good local Twin Cities antiques show at which to sell their wares. So, naming the group Prime Promotions, they just started their own. Only a few dozen dealers turned out for that first show.

Fast forward to 2013, and most of those original dealers are still helping to run the event. Of course, there are a lot more than a few dozen dealers now. Several hundred now set up at each and every show, some outdoors around the race track, and many more indoors in the grandstand concourse. Quite a few of those dealers have been coming here for most of the show's two-plus decades, a testament to the success of the event.

The nine local dealers that founded the show all specialized in antique furniture, so the show developed a reputation as one of the best area shows to find quality antique & vintage furniture. And that tradition continues to this day. Many of the region's best furniture restorers can be found at each Minnesota's Antique Spectacular Show.

This spring those dealers included 9th Street Antiques, one of the Midwest's best known furniture specialists. They came with their usual stunning display of high-end furniture, lighting, and more. And country and primitive furniture are always in style at Iowa's Out & About Antiques, where I found gems including a 19th century Pennsylvania step-back cupboard in an exceptional original faux-burl finish, asking price \$3,650.

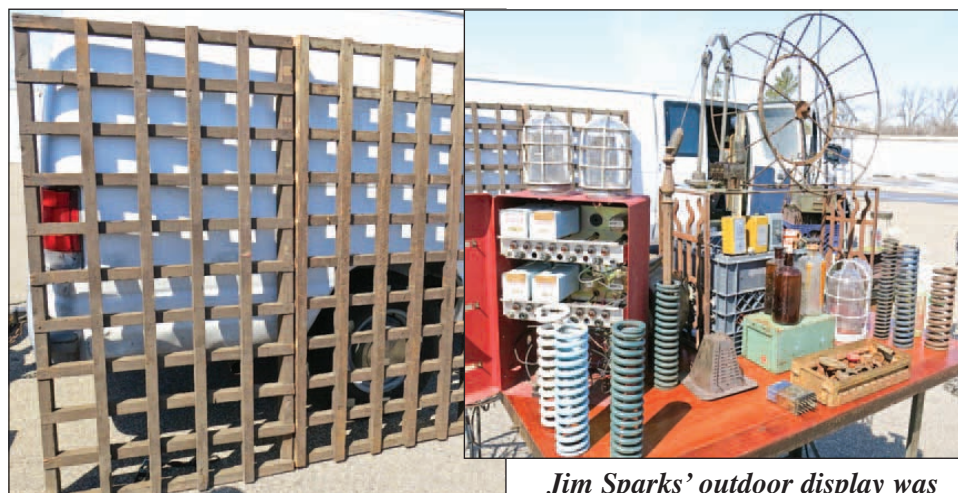
Mid Century Modern more your thing? Look no further than the display of Jim Caffery, who carries nothing but classic Heywood-Wakefield furniture. A dining table with triple wishbone legs (\$1,250) was a standout there, as was a three-door buffet, price tag only \$625.

There wasn't a stick of furniture at Carousel Antiques, who specializes in vintage advertising and toys of every description. Petroliana enthusiasts found much to love there, my favorites a hard-to-find White Rose Gasoline 48" porcelain sign (\$2,495) and an iconic Mobiloil Pegasus in nice condition priced at \$2,200.

And no matter what your interests, you were likely to find it at Schoolmaster Antiques. Their eclectic display contained everything from a pair of pristine Victorian ping pong paddles (\$950) to a pretty-cool 1949 Coca-Cola "Hole in One Club" promotional cooler - \$1,750.

A surprise spring snowstorm the day before the show didn't deter a decent group of outdoor vendors from setting up too. You'll find displays ranging from architectural artifacts to Depression glass to vintage bicycles among the hundreds of dealers large & small. I hope the photos give you a small idea of all the show has to offer.

If you missed this spring edition of the show, don't forget there's a fall show too, right here at the Minnesota State Fairgrounds in St. Paul. It happens on September 28th and 29th this year. 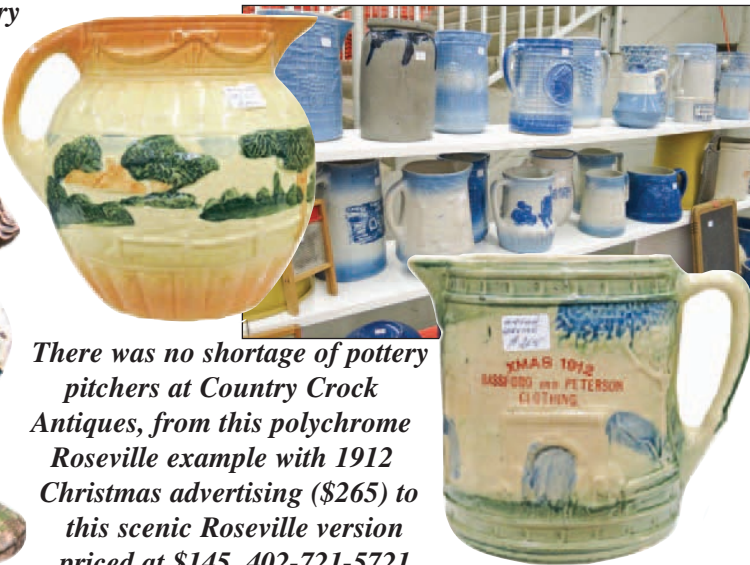

ISAS Donates \$2500 to Help Radiocarbon Date at the Morton Site

Here's a brief thank you note written by Dr. Michael Wiant:

On behalf of the Illinois State Museum Society and the archaeology program at Dickson Mounds Museum, I extend thanks to the Illinois State Archaeological Society for the generous grant. As we have in the past, we will apply these funds to the Morton site project. Based on work done at a nearby Oneota cemetery, Norris Farms #36, in the mid 1980's, Dickson Mounds Museum archaeologists have long been interested in studying everyday life at the nearby Morton site. In particular, we're interested in the interactions between indigenous Mississippian people and Oneota groups that arrive in the late 1200's. Funds from the grant will be used to obtain radiocarbon assays and to process flotation samples, which provide insight into diet. This summer archaeologists from Dickson Mounds and Michigan State University will begin a fifth year of field work at Morton.

Thank you to all members of the ISAS for continuing to show your support and helping to fund archaeological research throughout Illinois. These are tremendous efforts and you should take pride in knowing our society is helping to advance the knowledge of Illinois' prehistoric past.

When Donley's Wild West Town was built in 1974 to showcase his growing antique collection, the first public show was held there, and grew until eventually a banquet hall was built on the grounds to host them.

"This show is like a family reunion for the dealers and collectors, and for people who are really into phonographs and music boxes, this is the best place to be" says Mike Donley. "These machines are indicative of the time period. When the phonograph was invented, people were living, for the most part, in isolated rural areas. They had no electricity, no running water, and no modern conveniences. For the first time, they could go out and buy a machine that would sing them a song, tell them a story or a joke, or hear a President's speech. It's incomprehensible what that must have meant to people. They are pieces of history that changed the world."

What is Breweriana?



Breweriana is the collecting of “things” associated with the production, distribution, and advertising of beer. It is a term whose creation is attributed to XXX back in 19XX when collectors were seeking a term to describe a collecting area beyond “beer cans” which had gained great popularity in the mid 1970's. While beer cans are loosely a part of “breweriana” collecting, most in the hobby look upon breweriana as a separate and unique area of interest.

The more serious breweriana collectors may focus on prePro (preProhibition) collectibles dating prior to about 1919. Others enjoy the postPro era from 1933 through the 1950s when a large number of breweries came back into production and generated some of the more unique style of advertising. This era saw chalk statues, TOC (tin over cardboard) signs, great trays with outstanding graphics, lighted beer signs including neons, tap handles and much more.

As time moved in the 1960s and 1970s, the number of breweries began decreasing dramatically as the “big guys” (Budweiser, Miller, Coors, etc.) drove most of the smaller local breweries out of business. This era also coincided with the wide spread increase of television and cable television which siphoned off the advertising dollars of companies in areas other than TV which was more easily afforded by the big companies.

In the past 30 years with the coming of hundreds of microbreweries, brew pubs and contract brewers, collecting various forms of breweriana including glasses, coasters, labels, books, hats, shirts, etc. have brought many affordable collectibles to every budget. This allows the newcomer in breweriana collecting to start with readily available microbeer collectibles while they decide how deep in the older breweriana they may wish to dive.

The National Association Breweriana Advertising (NABA) is America's oldest and premier organization with a focus primarily on breweriana. While many members also enjoy beer can collecting most NABA members concentrate on many of the 100 or so other categories of breweriana identified. NABA has 20 Chapter affiliates around the country where members gather throughout the year to share a common interest in Breweriana Collecting.

Membership in NABA is only \$25 a year and includes 4 full color journals which contain articles about all phases of breweriana collecting and features stories on the history of old breweries. Members can insert buy-sell-trade ads at a very low rate.

Each year NABA holds a 4-day Convention where hundreds of members come to enjoy not only the buying-selling-trading of breweriana, but a wide variety of activities including a Brewmaster dinner, nostalgic bus tours, informational seminars, a member only auction and a Public Show open to everyone at no charge. This year's Convention will be held from July 30 to August 3 in Green Bay, Wisconsin.

The Public Show on Saturday August 3 is from 9:00am to 2:00 pm at the KI Convention Center which is attached to the Hyatt on Main hotel. We will be doing a FREE appraisal clinic for the public who wish to have their beer related items appraised by a panel of experts.

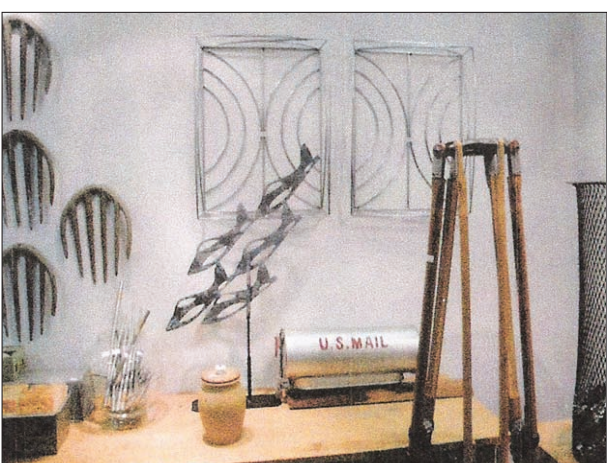

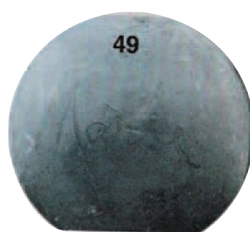

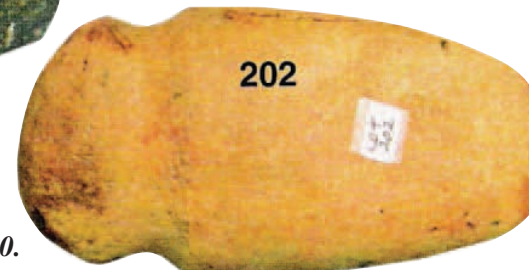
