Hundreds of Exhibitors, Thousands of Birds - at the 48th Annual National Antique Decoy & Sporting Collectibles Show

At this year's event, held on April 26th & 27th at the Pheasant Run Resort in St. Charles, Illinois, the huge Mega Center Exhibition Hall was filled with four-hundred tables of decoys and sporting collectibles. Buyers and sellers come from throughout North America and beyond, both for the show itself and for the several days of room-to-room trading that precede the show. Also not to be missed: the Guyette & Schmidt Decoy Auction held in conjunction with the show. It's quite probably the largest decoy auction in North America, grossing several million dollars, with individual decoys regularly selling for \$100,000 or more.

It's something you won't see anywhere else on the planet. Each year, I'm still amazed as I walk through the doors of the Pheasant Run Resort Mega Center, long-time host of the National Antique Decoy & Sporting Collectibles Show. The huge hall is a sea of literally tens of thousands of antique and vintage decoys and other sporting collectibles, completely filling the 38,000 square foot space. For many of the dealers, it's by far their most important event of the year. But the show itself is only part of the story for the decoy fanatics.

An entire wing of the Pheasant Run Resort gets filled with collectors as early as the Monday preceding the show itself, for the all-important room-to-room trading. For some, well over half of their sales take place before the show even begins! Trading takes place all day and late into each evening, you just pop into any of the 300-plus open doors. One collector likened it to a very plush indoor flea market for decoys.

By Wednesday, there are M.D.C.A. seminars to attend, as well as the preview for the much-anticipated Guyette & Schmidt auction. The auction itself is a two-day affair, held on both Thursday and Friday. And if that's not enough, the Callmakers & Collectors Association of America hold its annual convention and competition concurrently with the M.D.C.A. show, right here at the Pheasant Run Resort. Then there's the M.D.C.A. Show itself on both Friday and Saturday. Admission is only \$5 for adults and free for kids, and there's always plenty of free parking on the resort grounds. Each annual show has a featured exhibit of decoys - most all from the members own collections. This year: a fascinating display of classic Maryland decoys, plus a May 24th seminar discussing the Chesapeake Bay region's decoys and the men who made them.

Exhibitors come from all over the U.S. and Canada. And yes, you'll find the rarest-of-the-rare decoys here, selling for many tens of thousands of dollars. But those of us with thinner wallets had lots to choose from too. You'll find many thousands of vintage decoys and other sporting collectibles in a more modest price range. And of the contemporary carvers' offerings, when you consider the 100-plus hours a decoy carving might take to create, their prices start to look like fabulous bargains too.

You'll find nearly everybody associated with the world of decoy collecting at this event: hundreds of enthusiastic collectors of sporting memorabilia, many noted authors, and dozens of North America's best decoy carvers. If you have a few family heirloom decoys you want to find out a little more about, feel free to bring them along. Both days of the show offer free identification and evaluation services. Whether you're into decoys or not, you'll still have a wonderful time at the show.

It was a very busy week indeed for Midwest Decoy Collectors Association president Rick Sandstrom. He bought his first decoy at age twelve - and still has it to this day! "It was another great show for the club," Rick told me, "the exhibition hall was sold out as always, it was a gangbuster auction, with many lots exceeding their estimates, and we had among the most active room-to-room trading ever, with over 300 rooms booked as early as Friday of last week. I took a quick look at the license plates in the parking lot and counted vehicles from three-dozen states."

The Pheasant Run Resort, as it has for more than twenty years, will be home-base for the 49th edition of the National Antique Decoy & Sporting Collectibles Show - on April 24th & 25th of 2014. You can find more details at the club's website www.midwestdecoy.org. While you're there, print out a coupon for discount admission to the show, or better yet join the M.D.C.A. for only \$25. That'll get you all of the club's newsletters - as well as free admission to next year's show. And as always, keep an eye out for listings of the 2014 National Antique Decoy & Sporting Collectibles Show in the Auction Antique News!


