Auctioneer Carol Miller, owner of Bailey's Honor Auctions in Oconomowoc, Wisconsin held a specialty auction of Black Americana that featured a wide variety of collectibles including an Automoton Marching Band, a Folk Art Pastel Painting, Wind-up Toys, Postcards, a nice selection of Sterling Spoons, and so much more.

This auction featured a collection of items representing the history of Black Americana. Bailey's Honor Auction Company presented this auction understanding the collection's place in a historical and cultural context. The auction was held online and ended on Thursday, May 16th.

Tin wind-up toys were high on collectors list of items to bid for, with a Jazzbo Jim Tin Roof Dancer selling for \$425, a pair of Figural Butler Cast Iron Andirons brought \$275, a Folk Art Pastel of a Boy with Rooster (neat item) sold for a very reasonable \$45.



# With Seventy Dealers from Across the U.S., Lake Country Antiques & Art Show Doesn't Disappoint

The Lake Country Antiques & Art Show? The name may still not be familiar to you, but the show certainly is, for it's the new moniker for the popular Delafield Antique Show. With the move last season to improved facilities at the Olympic Resort & Spa in nearby Oconomowoc, show promoters Ron & Debby Christman decided to change the name of the event to better reflect the show's position as the premiere antiques event in the region just west of Milwaukee known as the Lake Country.

The new venue has a lot to offer for both visitor and exhibitor alike. There's a generous amount of free parking, plus nearly 20,000 square feet of exhibition space in two adjacent ballrooms. The resort also boasts 190 oversized guest rooms and suites, gourmet dining, an in-house night club - plus the 17,000 square-foot Olympic Spa.

But of course, I was here for an antiques show, and the exhibitor's displays were as impressive as ever. Regional fine art is a specialty here at the Lake Country Show, and among its purveyors was Richard Hartmann's Gallery of Wisconsin Art. Exhibiting here for the first time, he brought examples from iconic Badger State artists of the likes of Aaron Bohrod and Santos Zingale.

And the selection at Ralph Spano Antiques & Fine Art is always impressive. Highlights this spring included a monumental, just-acquired George Raab portrait of a woman; and a Louise Lemp Pabst pastel titled Reclining Nude, price tag \$9,500. Anglophile art enthusiasts found dozens of classic English oils at Randall Hopkins Antiques, who travelled from his home in London just for the Lake Country Show.

Period furnishings more your thing? It could be found all over the hall, from high-end Horner & Karpen in the displays of Milwaukee's 9th Street Antiques and Pierce Regal to a wonderland of rustic furniture at Michigan's Christiby's. Things couldn't have looked more different than at first-time exhibitor D & R International Antiques, whose booth was overflowing with continental art, clocks, and more.

And with seventy dealers coming from as far afield as Connecticut, there's something here for every taste and budget - from rare period advertising at Bob's Antiques to classic American country furniture at Country Peddlar Antiques to the monstrous 9' paper maché eagle at Crescent Worth Art & Antiques that had originally graced a Wisconsin Eagle Lodge.

It's finds like these that that keep shoppers coming back to the Lake Country Antiques & Art Show year after year. Ron and Debby Christman of the Antique Center at Wales did their usual great job organizing the event. Their multi-dealer shop, The Antique Center at Wales, is worth a look too, housed in a beautifully restored 19th century barn in nearby Wales, Wisconsin,



In 1892 the Roseville Pottery began producing utilitarian cooking vessels, flower pots and spittoons in Roseville, Ohio. George F. Young was the company's secretary, treasurer and general manager. The firm went out of business after a few years, and Young bought the business and

assumed the role of president, as well as continuing on as general Japanese-born artist manager. The Young family owned and managed the company continuously from 1896 until it closed in

ware. The Rookwood Pottery in Cincinnati was the pioneering Ohio art pottery maker, and along with various New England firms, had created and dominated the new market. Other Zanesville potteries, most notably the Weller Pottery and the Owens Pottery, had already started making decorative art pottery in Zanesville shortly before Roseville set up their primary shop there.

Roseville's first art lines included the blended glaze lines now called Majolica and Roseville's version of Rookwood's

experimentation to standardize Roseville's earthenware bodies, glazes and production process. Herold was also responsible for creating the Azurean line, a sort of blue standard glaze, and Modern Art, a line that brought the European art nouveau style to Roseville.

Roseville's most important early artist was the Englishman Frederick H. Rhead who came from a family of potters in Staffordshire, England. Only 22 when he emigrated to Wheeling, West Virginia to take a job with the Avon Pottery Company in 1902, Rhead moved 75 miles west to take a job at the Weller Pottery where he created several important pottery lines including Jap Birdimal and Rhead Faience. But Rhead's best early work was done at Roseville where he was hired as art director in 1904. There he created what is arguably America's greatest art pottery line, Della Robbia, and supervised the development of many of Roseville best early lines including Cremo, Crocus, Mongol, Egypto, Woodland, Olympic, Fudji, Matt Green, Creamware, Rozane Royal Light, and Crystalis among others. Examples of these rare, valuable and beautiful art pottery lines will be on display at the 2013 WPA Roseville Rosecraft, 1921, also known at Florane

While Harry did not produce the great art pottery that exemplified his brother's stay at Roseville, his oversight had a crucial economic impact on the company by de-emphasizing labor intensive, hand-tooled art ware in favor of molded ware with raised (embossed) Futura line seven years later. mile. patterns, which served as templates for hand

painted decoration of the pottery. This technique allowed less-skilled artisans to decorate more pieces, which increased the amount of ware produced, and profits, a trend that other Zanesville potteries such as Weller were also embracing. Harry Rhead designed several popular lines, including the Arts and Crafts Mostique, and the classically patterned Donatello, which featured embossed cherubs on a tan, green and white background. The Early Velmoss,

> Early Carnelian, Antique Matt Green, and Pauleo lines were also introduced during Harry Rhead's tenure at Roseville.

Frank Ferrell created the Roseville pottery that is most familiar and popular to antique lovers today. A Zanesville native and artist at several area potteries, he became Roseville's art director in 1919, and continued in that position until the plant closed in 1953. Ferrell designed nearly all of Roseville's Art Pottery during this period, about 90 lines in all. Ferrell sculpted the embossed patterns, designed thousands of shapes, and chose the colors based on ceramic engineer George Krause's beautiful and durable matt glazes.

One of Frank Ferrell's greatest creations for Roseville was the Pine Cone line. Introduced in the early 1930s in rich blue, golden brown, and soft green glazes, dard glaze line. Similar "standard glaze" Grocery chain, where they were given it was the company's best-selling line, and the legend is that it saved the firm from bankruptcy during the Depression, just as

> the Donatello pattern was said to have reversed the company's fortunes in 1915. Over 150 Pine Cone shapes were created, the largest number of forms in any Roseville line. A common misconception among beginning collectors is that Roseville lines were produced for one year only; in fact, the company continued making a line, and even adding new forms to it, until sales declined. The Pine Cone line is a good example of this. Pine Cone forms can be found unmarked (they probably had the silver or gold paper label used in the early 1930s), with an impressed mark, and, most commonly, with the raised script mark that was used after 1937. New Pine Cone forms were continually being added to the line. In 1953, Ferrell revisited the line and introduced 51 new shapes, all with raised script numbers in the 400s. It was named Pine

> Following World War II, Roseville encountered competition from cheaper art ware made overseas, as well as a burgeoning California commercial pottery industry. Despite efforts to modernize its style, and even enter the dinnerware market with Raymore dinnerware, Roseville closed its doors in 1954, ending an important period in Zanesville, and beginning a new era as one of America's foremost collectible potteries.





### "Catching" a Glimpse: A Look at Early Angling Photography

Anglers today have no valid excuse for not getting a good photo of a great catch. With modern technology placing cameras in nearly every cell phone & small pocket sized digital cameras available, there should be no "I swear it was this big......" stories told to fellow fishermen in an effort to exaggerate the size of the catch without a supporting photo. But this was not the case for the pioneers of the sport. In fact, early images of anglers & their gear are some of the most difficult photographs to locate, for several reasons. Perhaps most notable was the fact that fishing was not a recreational sport in the mid-to-late 1800's, unless you were wealthy; & in that case, only an extraordinary catch was likely to be deemed important enough to capture on film. When you add to that the need for bulky equipment for on site photography or the cost for a studio shot, it is easy to see why these very early photo images of yesterday's anglers are so

Introduced to the United States in 1839, the Daguerreotype was the first commercially successful image type, with larger East Coast cities having studios built for this method of portrait photography shortly after its introduction. Brought to America by inventor & artist, Samuel F.B. Morse, after a trip to France where he witnessed the process developed by Louis Daguerre & Joseph Niepce. It involved creat-

process. Producing images that did not have the shiny finish of a Daguerroeotype, at a greatly reduced cost, helped boost the popularity of the Ambrotype. Though examples are very

rare, each of these early methods produced some great images of early fishing

However, it wasn't until the introduction of the Tintype that outdoor photography became more prevalent, with the equipment more travel friendly & the images produced available for the customer within minutes. Introduced in the mid 1850's, the Tintype involved a process that used a sheet of iron blackened by painting as the medium for the collodion emulsion.

Images on paper began to appear with the introduction of the CDV, or Carte-de-Viste, which really gained a foothold on image photography around 1860. Made from an Albumen print, the American Fly Fisher, a publication of the paper images were placed on heavy cardstock, usually small, measuring approxi-

mately 2 x 3-1/2". These were replaced by a larger version of the same format circa 1870, the Cabinet Card, typically a

gear are still obtainable. Not only do they make great display items, they also show us just what, where, & how early tackle was used, which can be a tremondous help when putting together a display of correct period items.

As with most collectible fishing tackle, there are things to watch for that add to the desirability of any give item or photo. Clear photos that have indentifiable gear, such

as a Vom Hofe reel, Chapman metal lure, or an early wooden minnow are going to increase the value of any image, as well as photographs depicting famous fishermen such as James Henshall, Charles Orvis, or Seth Green. Subject & location can play an important role, too; an image of a child or a woman wielding fishing equipment is more difficult to find, & an outdoor scene in Daguerreotype or Ambrotype format much more elusive than the typical "set up" studio shots. Size is also a factor when determining value, as is often the case with collectible fishing lures, with the smallest & largest examples more uncommon than the standard sizes. With Tintype photos, full plate, or 6-1/2 x 8-1/2" images are very rare, as are the tiny 1/2 x 1" Gem size photos.

Another analogy to lures is the packag-

ing which housed these early photos. Like the box that adds to both the desirability & value of a given lure, so too are

the cases which held the three earliest photo types. These can substantially enhance the eye appeal & value of an image. Made with leather covers or completely of Gutta Percha, these cases can sometimes be more valuable than the images held inside.

Other formats used to capture angling images included the Stereo card, a side-by-side Albeumen image that created a three dimensional appearance when using a stereoview viewer. These interest-

ing cardstock images date between 1860 & 1920 & can be found with angling images taken outdoors, making better use of their three dimensional qualities.

Magic Lantern Slides were also a popular format for displaying images, using a glass plate image & projected light to view the photo on a wall or screen. Fishing images are often found in color with this format. Lastly, the real photo postcard is by far the easiest of all the early fishing images to find. Grewat cards depicting lures & reels used post-1900 can be still be obtained very reasonably, unless the lure or reel depicted can be identified, which can lead to higher prices due to competition from lure & reel collectors.

No matter what the format, vintage images of our sporting past can make for a fascinating collectcion, especially when displayed with the actual rod, reel or creel represented in the photograph. If this subject is of interest to you, I highly recommend obtaining a copy of "An Angler's Album - Fishing in Photographt & Literature" by Charles H. Traub, with an introduction by Charles Kuralt.

This is just one of many categories that members of the Midwest Decoy Collectors Association delve in. Membership includes an annual "Membership Directory", published in March, which includes members' collecting interest. The Midwest Decoy Collectors Association is a non-profit organization whose purpose is to collect & preserve the history of the decoy as original American folk art.


