



Wednesday Night Fun at Beloit Auction & Realty's Weekly Consignment Auction

For lots of area antique enthusiasts, Wednesday evenings just wouldn't be the same without the weekly United Country Beloit consignment auction. You never know what you'll find on any given Wednesday. One week might feature contemporary furnishings, the next tools or vintage jewelry. And one sale each month is reserved for the best antique & collectible consignments - like this July 31st sale I attended.

Many in the crowd came for a look at one of the sale's featured items: a 1927 Chevrolet Capitol sedan with only 12,000 miles on the odometer. "The car has had only two owners over its nearly ninety year life," said auctioneer Rich Ranft. That second owner, who'd purchased it in 1970, brought the vehicle to the auction along with a full family history which he related to Ranft.

"The original owner bought the car new from the Chevrolet dealer in Leaf River, Illinois in 1927. He told us of riding to town with his father on the buckboard to look at new cars. This Chevrolet dealer had one just like this one. His father drove it, and they decide to buy an identical one. The money was paid and the order was placed to the factory by phone that day. The next day they returned on the buckboard, riding to Janesville in the dealer's car where they received a tour of the factory, picking up the car at the end of the line to drive home."

The car was used until 1939, stored and used again for a short period in 1945. "Rough" is the best word I could find to describe the car; but with a great story, low miles, plus its original owner's manual and some spare parts was still a nice buy at \$1,850.

Furniture was another of the evening's big draws. Most did quite well pricewise, the best of the bunch a restored 19th century walnut cylinder-front secretary/desk that sold for \$750. Other furniture highlights included a vintage Jacobean-style oak dining suite that surprised many by bringing \$725, and an oak side-by-side secretary that fetched \$675.

And that huge smoking pipe collection? It was sold in two large lots, with the first bringing \$1,200, the second \$500. Other auction highlights ranged from a large Reed & Barton Sterling flatware set selling for \$2,200 to a lot of vintage fashion jewelry (including Miriam Haskell pieces) that made \$800. All of the 300-plus lots were on their way home with new owners within a few hours, thanks to the efficient Beloit Auction staff.





Dealers Embrace New Berrien Springs, MI Show

You bet I'll be back," said dealer Larry Simpson of Niles, Mich., as he attached a "sold" tag on 4' long Civil War musketoon tagged at \$650. Many people stopped to admire his 30" long "cabin shaped" primitive toolbox priced at \$225, which he said was "one of most unusual I've ever seen."

Another primitive container, an 1850s sewing box with hand carved decorations and metal corners, was offered for \$85 by Paul Funk of Funks Junk, Waldron, Mich. Movie and advertising poster collectors had a choice of eight different 1940s cardboard movie posters from the the Qincy, Mich., Our Theater priced at \$12 each.

What one visitor called "serious antiques" were offered by Roger Fletcher of Blanchard, Mich. A Qing dynasty 15" tall bronze statue was priced at \$4,500, while an 18" carved wood 1800s Kenya mask could be displayed for \$300. The dealer said other items in his booth were priced at \$15 and up.

Still other early antiques were shown by Darren Bianco of Granger, Ind., including an 1830s French cavalry steel breast plate priced at \$550, a 16th century Indo-Persian oval shield tagged \$1,200 and an 1800s British cavalry officer breast plate priced at \$650.

It was a family outing for Phil and Kay Garrison and daughter Melinda who traveled from Plymouth, Ind. They showed off a Victorian woven basket tagged at \$37.50 that looked right at home on top of a painted white 1870s Eastlake style commode which was offered for \$125. Many stopped to admire the 1997 contemporary sterling silver bracelet marked "Tiffany" that could grace your wrist for \$145.

Collectors of designer furniture checked out the pair of 1970s Herman Miller Eames chaise lounge chairs with matching ottoman. Dealer Barb Loveland of Grand Rapids, Mich., priced the set at \$2,500. Loveland's boothmate, Linda Powell, also of Grand Rapids, showed a 1930s picnic basket containing a silver plate sandwich box, salt and pepper box and Bunsen burner that could be displayed -- or used -- for \$350.

Howard Busse of Anvil Antiques, of St. Joseph, Mich., pointed out a "12-inch tall salesman sample axe" priced at \$125. Weller pottery collectors were wowed by his early 1900s bird design pitcher that could be taken home for \$125.

Traveling from Mt. Prospect, Ill., Sylvia Giannini caught jewelry collectors' eyes with a long string display of 100 earrings that could be purchased for \$10 per pair and worn at the show. A 1950s seed-bead decorated 1950s purse in a "rare yellow color" could decorate your arm for \$85.

Ray Mellinder of Sunset Junque of South Haven, Mich., spread out in a grassy outside booth to show 30" tall letters spelling "YMCA" for \$100 while a smaller set spelling "HOME" was priced at \$40. Mellinder said his Lake Michigan shop 5 miles north of South Haven contained many thousands of architectural and eclectic items priced at \$5 and up, with a "free Sunset Junque T-shirt awarded to buyers if their pile of purchases is big enough."

Hundreds of glass pieces filled the booth of Jim Cooper, of Modern Times Antiques, Grand Haven, Mich. The dealer called attention to "a very unusual color yellow butter print" design four-piece Pyrex bowl set offered for \$130. Ice cream parlor collectors checked out his 1940s Carnation malted milk glass container with tin lid priced at \$175, while a 1950s Nesbitt's Hot Fudge electric pot could be displayed, or used, for \$65.


A long line of 1800s oil lamps filled the top shelf display of Bill and Juanita Wallis of Stevensville, Mich. The early lighting devices were priced from \$48 to \$195 each. An unusual deco shaped 1930s cast metal advertising ashtray was tagged at \$35.

One shopper was happy as he left the fairgrounds after "making a purchase for a friend." Bill Norton, a breweriana collector from Augusta, Mich., showed off a wood Miller beer sign he bought for a buddy. Norton said he collects pre-prohibition items from the old T.M. Norton Brewing Co., in Anderson, Ind., adding, "I made some great buys at the show but nothing for my collection -- maybe in September". The Berrien Springs Show was one of four different markets that were run by Zurko

Promotions on the same weekend. The busy promoter said there are events held 40 weekends per year run by his firm, with "the biggest and best" at Grays Lake, Ill.






