It's true. Bernie Smits was a "picker" decades before the term even existed. I guess that's what growing up in the family salvage business will do to you. So collecting is both a business and an obsession for Bernie and his wife Mary, who've accumulated an amazing amount of collectibles over the years. Selling antiques started almost by accident for the pair. "We were using vintage bicycles that came into the salvage yard as lawn decorations, and customers asked if they owners Bernie & Mary Smits on hand could buy them and do the same," Bernie to greet you. They're open seven days a told me, "and that's how Pedal Pushers was born."

Fast forward a decade or two, and the Smits realized they needed a dedicated site for their antiques enterprise. So just this year, they built Pedal Pushers Antiques & Collectibles in tiny Denmark, Wisconsin a stone's throw south of Green Bay. And it's hard to miss! The 7,000-square-foot structure looks for all the world like an old time general store, with a two-story cedar

But it's what awaits within that will truly impress antiques enthusiasts. Bernie and Mary have diverse collecting interests, and that's reflected in the store's inventory. Inside, you'll find choice collections of everything from trade stimulators to art glass to period tin toys. And what about those vintage bicycles? There are probably a hundred or more here, displayed in long rows atop the countless showcases.

And as you arrive at Pedal Pushers Antiques & Collectibles you won't fail to guess what Bernie's other main collecting interest is: classic cars. He's installed several special display pads out front just to show them off. There the day I visited were

some real show-stoppers, from a baby-blue 1956 Mercury Monterey (\$4,500), to a 1949 Hudson Commodore, asking price \$7,500.

The Smits will be bringing many more classic cars to the shop from their collection, including in no particular order: a 1961 Ford Thunderbird, 1958 & '59 Studebakers, a 1963 Corvair, a 1932 Chevrolet Coupe, a 1932 Willys, and a 1967 Triumph

derbuss was in stock when I visited, along with some rare German drilling rifles, and American classics from the likes of Colt and Winchester. Some early Winchester calendars hung on the wall nearby, as did a 21" "Ask for Winchester Guns & Cartridges advertising clock, price tag \$4,000.

Need a break after all that antiquing? You won't have to go far, as Pedal Pushers Antiques & Collectibles has its very own attached deli, coffee, wine, and cheese shop called Blossoms/Steve's Cheese. "Take a load off" there, where you can enjoy their selection of Collectivo coffees - or a bite to eat including homemade bakery goods and fudge made fresh daily by owner Tammy Smits-Sommer. Both would make great gifts too, as would something from their extensive wine & cheese selections.

So be sure to stop by Pedal Pushers Antiques & Collectibles next time you're heading north on Interstate-43 for a visit long-or-short. They're open year 'round seven days a week from 10:00 to 5:30. And for you dealers out there, Pedal Pushers also has some showcases available to rent - just call Bernie or Mary at 920-863-8984 for details. 







To increase funds and support for its new museum space, the RWCS Foundation held "Wine-ing for Red Wing" - an event that featured food and bevof the Pottery Place Annex building to house the new Red Wing Pottery

Museum, which is scheduled to open during next year's RWCS Convention on July 9, 2014. The RWCS Foundation took in more than \$30,000 in donations over the course of the week.

The year's commemorative, which could be purchased only by RWCS members, was a Red Wing stoneware Bulldog figure. Two limited-edition commemoratives were also produced. These were mixed in with the regular commemoratives and all commemoratives were packaged in sealed boxes, so a small number of members were fortunate enough to get one. Of all the Commemorative Bulldogs that were made, 90 percent were brown, 9 percent were white and black and 37 were two-toned tan. RWCS Commemorative Manager Bob Morawski also had several special items made that were auctioned off to benefit the Society.

Attendees had a good selection of topics to learn about during the educational sessions held on July 12, including an orientation for first timers, Red Wing zinc glaze, Red Wing 101, recent finds from the old pottery dump, Red Wing dinnerware, history of the villages surrounding the Goodhue County clay pits, Red Wing bowls and creating the 2013 RWCS Commemorative. Local potter Richard Spiller and Finnish potter Aba Luostarinen held hands-on pottery classes for adults, and the RWCS Foundation held an info session on all the news surrounding the future Red Wing Pottery Museum. In addition, the 2nd annual Crock Fest celebration featuring food vendors and music by The Crusiers was held at Red Wing's Central Park later that day. It was sponsored by Maple City Pottery.

Another unique aspect of the RWCS Convention was the participation of the younger generation through the KidsView program. The Society is on the leading edge of creating engaging and educational ways to get the younger generations involved in collecting. The focus on these RWCS members is an important part of the vision of the Society to ensure its continued existence and growth. Many interactive and challenging activities and seminars were offered for children of all ages, such as learning

how to bid at an auction, what to look for in an antique, and several hands-on pottery creation projects. KidsView Co-Chairs Sue Tagliapetra and Aarika Floyd announced at the annual business meeting at the end of the week that they were stepping down from their roles after many combined years of service. They were given a standing ovation from those in attendance.
