

Munda Auctions: Fifty-Plus Years of Quality Antique & Estate Auctions

For more than fifty years, antique enthusiasts have been making the scenic drive to historic Freeport, Illinois to see just what Munda Auctions has to offer. One week might feature early furniture & accessories, the next cast iron toys. And Freeport's proximity to the history-rich city of Galena has also meant that Munda Auctions is likely to offer more than its fair share of one of early Galena's most cherished products: Galena pottery.

Produced in the latter half of the 19th century, Galena's potters were noted for a distinctive style of earthenware pottery in glazes that ranged from somber browns to attractive greens and oranges. Munda Auctions often includes several examples, with around a dozen crossing the block at this November 29th Thanksgiving Auction. Most were smaller storage jars, ranging from a little 4 ?" medicine jar to larger versions approaching a foot in height. And it was that diminutive medicine jar that ended up as the Galena potter winner of the sale, fetching a surprising \$1,300.

And while many buyers, both in-house and online, may have come for the pottery, there were finds in pretty-near every category of antiques. Most unusual lots of the auction? How about two Japanese Samurai swords. Both found ready buyers, with the earlier 16th century example bringing \$1,400. Scandinavian woodenware winners included an 1858 Norwegian tine that made \$425, and a dated-1890 wedding bowl that sold for \$300.

It really was a gem of an auction, with plenty of surprises, and a few bargains thrown in too.



The Third Sunday Antiques Market in Bloomington, Illinois: More Than a Quarter-Century and Growing

At first glance, Bloomington, Illinois might not seem like the logical location for a large and successful antiques show. If you take a second look though, it makes a lot of sense. Bloomington, along with its sister city Normal, is among the fastest growing metropolitan areas in Illinois. The twin-cities have garnered numerous accolades in recent years as well, such as Money Magazine's "Best Places to Live" award, and were somewhat surprisingly rated as one of the top-five places to play golf in the U.S. by Golf Digest Magazine.

Located half-way between Chicago and St. Louis, Bloomington-Normal is located within three-hundred miles of an amazing thirty-million people, and is an hour's drive or less for nearly three-quarters of a million folks.

The show was founded by Bloomington natives Don and Carol Raycraft back in 1988. Their names may be familiar to you, since they've authored more than fifty books on antiques and collectibles, ranging from Collecting Baseball Player Autographs to the popular Raycraft's Auction Field Guide, written by Don along with his son R.C.

"I've never been an antiques dealer" Don told me, "but I've been collecting since I was a boy. Back in 1988, we realized there was a need for an antiques show here in central Illinois, and the Third Sunday Antiques Market was born. At that first show, we were literally stunned to see 1,000 people lined up to get in, and the show's been growing ever since." Don has largely handed over the reins of the show to son Mike, whose public relations experience serves the event well. "With hundreds of dealers to choose from, shoppers are likely to find what they're looking for," related Mike. "We try to always have a wide cross-section of dealers at each show, ranging from

high-end American furniture to vintage toys and sporting collectibles. And it's definitely not a flea market – with a majority of the dealers selling quality antiques and collectibles."

The dealers come from more than a dozen states, some even as far as Canada. Old Smith Company was among those dealers, bringing lots of choice period toys - plus sports-related artifacts from vintage duck decoys to a set of Knute Rockne bookends. And fine art was the focus at nearby Mary K. Miller Antiques, my favorite there a landscape by noted Danish artist Thorvald Niss.


Primitives more your thing? There were great examples all over the show, from the painted furniture at both Bear Your Heart and Hedgeapple Primitives to a wonderland of country accessories in first-time exhibitor Wanda Galloway's display. No matter what your collecting tastes, you're likely to find it here -from rare Civil War memorabilia at Abe's Old Hat to pin-up art to spare right next door at Illinois Pickers.

As its name suggests, Third Sunday Antiques Market is held on the third Sunday of each month, from May through November. Fifteen years ago, the event grew so large it moved to the Interstate Center, a 120-acre facility right at the intersection of Interstates I-39, I-55, and I-74. There, you can visit the hundreds of outdoor vendors in the morning, then if it gets a little warm (or cold), see hundreds more inside the climate controlled main exhibition halls.

Be sure to check out their website too: www.thirdsundaymarket.com. There, you'll find directions to the facility, links to local lodging and dining, as well as dealer information. Of course the Third Sunday Market's 2014 season has passed, but the first of the 2015 shows will be here before you know it on February 22nd. Just keep an eye out for listings of it, and all of the other 2015 Third Sunday Antiques Markets, in the Auction Action Antique News!




