Get the holiday blues? Well, Tumbleson Auction has the cure for you! They're famous for their big, multi-day holiday auctions held several times each year. I headed down to their twin auction galleries in Princeton, Illinois for their latest event - a three-day New Year's Weekend Auction. No matter what you collect, you probably would have found it there. Day-one saw everything from high-end art glass to Victorian furniture cross the block. Vintage cars & advertising were day-two highlights. And sporting collectors were all here for Saturday's finale, with decoys by makers of the likes of Perdew - plus countless period guns, fishing lures, and the like. Star of the sale: a rare '34 Ford Model-B pickup that rolled off for a cool \$18,000!

Day-three's decoy winner was this 1940's Charles

Perdew Illinois River mallard drake that fetched \$2,000.

Family lore was that this large hand-painted French wall hanging was taken directly from Adolf Hitler's home by an American soldier at the end of WWII. Who knows if it's true, but it managed to sell for \$3,200 nonetheless.

Auctioneers Tom & Mary Tumbleson with the top-lot of the three-day sale: a rare 1934 Forb Model-B promotional pickup truck that rolled off for a cool \$18,000!

It took a \$3,400 bid to win this marked Handel slag glass table lamp with a tropical motif.

Appraisal Institute Releases Its 2014 "Trending Data" For Antiques & Collectibles

It's been almost three years since the Asheford Institute of Antiques, a professionallevel, distance learning program on antiques, collectibles and appraising, released its inaugural report on buying and collecting trends within the antiques and collectibles community. But this year they're back with a new survey that's aimed at what the school calls, "the more relevant aspects" of the antiques marketplace, according to school spokesperson Tony Drew. "When originally released, our first survey was meant to merely gauge general areas of antique interest, but now that we've garnered some fairly extensive data over the past few years, we're finding that much of that information seems to be backing-up our initial discovery regarding the movement of certain antique trends within the marketplace," said Drew.

The latest survey, which was compiled from enrolled students and former graduates of the Institute, was intended to focus on the current trends of antiques and collectibles, and was based on sales and buyer's requests for specific items. And while no measurable scientific practices were utilized, and the survey remained informal in nature, the results still proved quite illuminating, said school Deputy Director, Chris Hughes, "What we've really noticed, is that there continues to be an apparent shift in the marketplace - especially when it comes to the younger generation - categories that tended to gain traction and move up the list in a truly meaningful way, were almost invariably connected to younger buyers. Conversely, categories of antiques that seemed to be off the Internets central radar, appeared to remain relatively neutral in their respective rankings, and any movement that did occur, was usually the result of older more established buyers.

The link between young and old was not lost on Don Kirpatrick, a 30-something dealer in the Northeast, who participated in the school's original survey, as well as the current one, and who agrees with the Institutes latest findings, "A few years ago I started sensing that younger buyers were interested in different periods, and so I began adjusting my buying - I dumped the heavy ornate Victorian stuff - and instead concentrated on Art Nouveau, Art Deco, and even some 50's kitsch, and it's really paid off." says Kirpatrick. Staffers from the school also noted this sentiment, saying that many of the respondents from the latest survey had echoed these same thoughts, stating in essence that there had been a noticeable shift in overall buying preferences towards the "flashier" side of the Victorian spectrum. "It's just not my parents antique store any more," said Julie Walsh, a dealer on the West coast, "I mean, I just can't sell what they sell... It simply doesn't resonate with my generation." According to Shirley Huey, one of the staffers involved in completing the survey, younger dealers continued to have very different items and inventory when compared to older dealers. In fact, said Huey, "Not only were they vastly different when it came to inventory, but in their marketing approaches as well. It's a trend we're likely to continue to see," added Huey.

School spokesperson, Tony Drew noted that while the latest survey conducted by the Institute was by no means scientific in nature, it still managed to show the development of certain patterns and trends within today's antiques and collectibles marketplace. "I think our survey is here to stay," said Drew, "We've had an awful lot of requests since the first one came out, so it's likely we'll continue with them well into the future."





Big Turnout, Big Fun, at Tumbleson Auction's Three-Day New Year's Weekend Sale

Tumbleson Auction conducts close to one-hundred auctions each year, but has become famous for their multi-day holiday events. Pretty much pick a major holiday and Tumbleson Auction will be having a two or three-day auction. Princeton, Illinois may seem like it's far away, but it's actually just a two-hour drive from Madison, Chicago, or Dubuque. The TT Tumbleson Auction Gallery is just a few blocks off of Interstate 80 in north-central Illinois.

They don't actually have an auction gallery - they have two. On big Holiday events like this one, auction-goers have an opportunity to preview all three days of the auction set up in the adjoining climate-controlled twin halls - a big convenience for both buyers and sellers alike.

I attended the first day of the sale, which offered the full-house crowd a wide array of quality antiques from a huge local estate - from art glass and pottery to Victorian furniture to some choice period lighting. And it was that lighting that proved the most popular. The clear winner: a Teco pottery table lamp topped by a signed Tiffany Studios shade that for \$4,900. A marked Handel slag glass table lamp did well too, fetching a solid \$3,400.

Day-two was a mix of area estates. There was furniture from country & city, period advertising, a collection of toy sewing machines, and vehicles new & old. The half-dozen late model cars & trucks did well as always, but the vintage vehicles were of course the big draw of the day. A pretty cool 1976 MGB convertible was driven off by a lucky buyer for \$3,400. It was left in the dust, though, by that 1934 Ford Model B Pickup truck. A promotional model in nice condition, it saw competitive bidding from many in the crowd, and sold for a whopping \$18,000.

drawers below - \$500.

Things couldn't have looked more different than on sporting collectibles Saturday - day-three of the sale. There were guns from the as far back as the flintlock days, plus pretty much anything else related to the outdoor pursuits. A flock of vintage decoys filled several tables - many of them coveted Illinois River birds. A 1940s example by Henry, Illinois' own Charles & Edna Perdew proved to be the winner of the bunch, bringing \$2,000.

Charlie was born near Henry in 1874 and was a hunter and carver of decoys. Edna was born in Henry too, and their marriage in 1902 formed an artistic partnership that lasted almost sixty years. For much of that time, Charlie carved and Edna painted from their home and workshop at the edge of town. That humble homestead is now the Charles Perdew Museum, open on summer Sundays. Just go to www.charlesperdew.com for all the details. Other Saturday highlights ranged from a Colt Army Frontier 44/40 pistol selling for \$1,650 to a 19th century iron door from a Bureau County, Illinois jail cell that was carted off for \$575.

Tumbleson Auction has built up quite a loyal following in their thirty-plus years of operation: it was a full house for all three sale days with a crowd of both local folks and collectors from several states. Tom, Mary, and second-generation bid-caller Tiffany Foes are fast and friendly auctioneers. Each sell at close to one-hundred & forty lots per hour, so grab a catalog, find a seat, and be sure to keep your bid card








