





It's now been forty-one years that the Wisconsin Antique Dealers Association has been putting on this winter-edition antiques show. That's quite an accomplishment in itself, but you have to remember that this show is a relative newcomer to the WADA show schedule. The original WADA Fall Antiques Show & Sale will be celebrating its sixty-fourth anniversary later this year! There can't be too many other antiques associations around that can make that claim.

And in those six-plus decades, WADA has done much more than just hold antiques shows. As a non-profit organization dedicated to preserving the State's cultural heritage, WADA has a long history of providing grants to groups throughout the State including the Friends of the Wisconsin Historical Society and many other Badger State not-for-profit organizations.

All of the WADA shows are held at the Waukesha Expo Center, just a short drive west of Milwaukee. It's a great show site - right off the interstate, with lots of free parking. Inside, the dealers can spread out among the three well-lit adjacent halls of the Forum Building. It's those dealers, of course, that are the reason that folks have been coming to the WADA shows for so long. And with more than fifty dealers at both the fall and winter editions of the event, you're almost sure to find something to love.

And while the WADA Show is best known for classic Americana, you'll now find purveyors here with everything from Arts & Crafts furniture to vintage advertising. Like at Coin Operations, whose display was filled with "big boy's toys" like vending machines, one-armed bandits, and more. Or at Elves Antiques, where the focus is always on the Holidays. There, shoppers found Christmas memorabilia from the 19th century onwards, plus some great vintage Halloween decorations.

Fine furniture more your thing? There were examples all over the show, from the

classic American country furniture at both Pipsqueak & Me Antiques and Beneath the Dust Antiques. And J & L Antiques' booth did a brisk business in primitives of all sorts. Among the fifty-plus quality dealers who exhibit at every WADA Antiques Show & Sale, you're just about sure to find something to love, whether your tastes run to sophisticated fine art or to rustic artifacts.

WADA is also continuing its founding sponsorship of the 30th Star Benefit Antiques Auction, a biennial fundraiser held at the Wisconsin Historical Society's Old World Wisconsin Historic Site. The 2016 edition of the event is still a year away, but they've already gotten some wonderful donations. Most notable among them are two "outsider art" pieces from Wisconsin's Adam Berg. Berg retired to Wild Rose after life as a Chicago cab driver, and produced some astonishing works he called "oil carvings." And one of the artworks slated for the auction is his self-described "masterpiece of his life's works" - a monumental & highly detailed scene titled Heaven on Earth.






