The Rural Life Antique Show & Sale: An Integral Part of Illinois Amish Country's Spring Antiques Weekend



From Vintage Toys to Civil War Memorabilia 🐗 at January 24th, 2015 Donley Estate Auction

The Donley Auction House in Union, Illinois has hosted some spectacular auctions since opening their doors two years ago, most notably their big Spring Classic and Fall Classic Auctions. You might remember some highlights from those events - like that circa-1890 soda fountain interior that sold for \$170,000, or the tiny, funky, BMW Isetta Limousine that rolled off for \$30,000.

And for 2015 and beyond, Donley Auctions will be conducting many more auctions, both those big Spring and Fall Classics plus a series of regular consignment and estate auctions at their newly-outfitted auction facility. I went to the first of their consignment sales of the year, settling the eclectic estate of a longtime Chicago collector.

It was the vintage toys that drew many to the Saturday sale. They ranged from classic Lionel trains to the popular tin-litho toys from the mid-20th century. That previously mentioned Marx Yeti proved the most popular of the bunch. Made in Japan for Marx in the early 1960s, the remote-controlled Yeti lumbered along slowly, occasionally making a loud shriek. This example was in nice shape with a fair box, and sold for \$650.

There were plenty of bidders too for a 1930s Kingston Electricar Auto Builder Set. In mint condition and complete with all boxes, the Kokomo, Indiana-made toy was a good buy at \$475. Other "kid stuff" highlights: a 1948 Schwinn Excelsior boy's bicycle that made \$750, and a similar Arnold, Schwinn, & Co. girl's bike fetched \$650.

Not into toys? There was something here for you as well. Of the period American furniture, an early 19th century Sheraton cabinet-on-chest was the winner, selling for \$600. Other items of note included several 19th century oils and watercolors that brought up to \$700 apiece, and a 1950s Genco Bowl-A-Lane tavern shuffleboard game that sold for \$550.

Donley Auctions is located a short drive west of Chicago in little Union, Illinois. You're probably already familiar with the family's other venture, the venerable Donley's Wild West Town. It's an old-school Old West theme park, complete with shoot-em-ups and pony rides for the kids. Also there: the Village Hall Banquet Facility that can seat up to four-hundred guests, which annually plays host to the world's largest Antique Phonograph & Music Box Show. And don't forget the Donley's Wild West Museum, with displays of cowboy, mining, and Civil War artifacts - plus a world-class antique phonograph collection to boot.

Donley Auction's next big sale will happen on April 11th and 12th - a huge sale of rare Grateful Dead memorabilia. 





Spring Edition Success for Tuscola, Illinois' Rural Life Antique Show & Sale

Tuscola, Illinois is a quintessentially Midwestern town, home to around 4,500 folks and the seat of Douglas County. The imposing Douglas County Courthouse dominates the town center, but the area is known much better for something else: its large and growing Amish community, founded in the 1860s and now numbering nearly five-thousand strong. A significant tourism industry has grown right along with them too, with dozens of shops selling Amish-made products ranging from rustic furniture to handmade cheeses

As you might imagine, the picturesque area is natural location for country-oriented antiques shows. The "A Gathering on the Prairie" show was the first of the now four antiques shows participating in the Illinois Amish Country Spring Antiques Weekend, and just celebrated its thirteenth season. It and two other antiques shows are located in Nearby Arthur, Illinois, with this Rural Life Antique Show & Sale just down the road in Tuscola.

Donna Kidwell, ably assisted by her husband Richard, founded the show in 2011. She's uniquely qualified for the task, having operated Tuscola's Winterberry antiques shop for a quarter of a century. "It's an exciting antiquing area, especially during the spring and fall shows," Donna told me. "And with dealers coming from all over the country, you never quite know what will turn up."

Michigan's Caulkins House Antiques was among those dealers. They brought classic Americana with an emphasis on New England country furnishings, as did nearby Fred Henderson Antiques. There sat two tall case clocks made by Connecticut's Silas Hoadley, one of the fathers of American clock-making along with Eli Terry and Seth Thomas.

Folk art more your thing? There were great examples all over the show – from a funky carved zoo animal display cabinet in Susan & Rod Bartha's display to a pig themed breadboard painting by noted folk artist Art Glazier at Erlenbusch Haus Antiques. And while the focus of the show is on country & primitive antiques, you'll find exhibitors specializing in everything from antique advertising to vintage toys and more. And remember, your weekend's not over yet, as you've got at least three other shows to visit with a few minutes of Tuscola!

This Spring Illinois Amish Country Antiques Weekend was just the beginning of the region's 2015 events. April 23rd through the 25th brings the Amish Country Quilt Show, followed by the venerable Moultrie-Douglas Combined County Fair in July. And tens of thousands of visitors come each Labor Day Weekend for the Amish Country Cheese Festival, as they've done for more than forty years. 



And for the grown up kids, the ones that are still living to hang on to that happy childhood, there are many great embossed W.H. Co., VG cond, toys. From pressed steel trucks to a fabulous Steelcraft Murray 1928 Chevrolet pedal car, there are plenty of ways to remember your days of driving on your own winding dirt roads.

> But if you don't like riding in a pedal car...you can ride on a very rare c.1915 Olfort Hobby Horse. This rare steed is in superb original condition and stands over 40" tall. It must be the true thoroughbred of riding horses. The highly mechanical structure gallops forward as you pull on the reigns. The patent drawings may offer a clue as to why this beast is rare.
