


building. When my husband (Todd) and I arrived, WE Energies was still here

You never know quite what you'll find at any given Beloit Auction & Realty weekly Wednesday consignment auction. One week might feature antique furniture and collector cars, the next fine art and vintage jewelry. At this February sale, the entire estate of a prominent Rockford-area physician filled the hall.

Fine art was here in abundance. The four large contemporary Frederic Remington bronze sculptures on custom pedestals were hard to miss. Best among them - a version of his iconic "Coming through the Rye." The artist's most ambitious sculpture, it depicts four cowboys on horseback whooping it up as they shoot their six-guns. This example measured 29" in height, and sold to an in-house bidder for \$2,000.

The fine art winner of the evening, however, was an unassuming little oil-on-canvas landscape by American Impressionist painter Edward Henry Potthast. A lithographer by career, the Ohio-born Potthast moved to New York and years later began a career as an artist at the age of thirty-nine. He's best known for his paintings of families at leisure in Central Park and the nearby New England beaches. This little 9" x 12" Potthast example was more of an ethereal landscape, and went home with a happy buyer for \$4,100.

The estate's quality furnishings and jewelry were the night's other big draws. Among the latter, a 14k gold tennis bracelet studded with eight carats of diamonds was the winner pricewise, selling for \$3,400. A ladies platinum and 1.51 carat diamond engagement ring found a buyer at \$2,900, and a pretty-cool vintage Masonic-themed Waltham men's wristwatch made \$450.

Other auction highlights ranged from a super-clean 1999 Mercury Marquis LS that sold for \$6,600 to a 208 troy ounce set of Franklin Mint commemorative Sterling medals that fetched \$3,000. All of the near-300 lots were on their way home with new owners within a few hours, thanks to the efficient Beloit Auction staff.

Blackhawk Center Hosts Sixty-Fifth Annual Oregon, Illinois Antiques Show

If you're coming into the little town of Oregon, Illinois from the north, be sure to take Route 2, one of the most scenic drives in the northern part of the state. The road follows the meandering Rock River from Rockford, through the little town of Byron, and on to Oregon itself.

And just north of Oregon at Lowden State Park, look across the river, and you'll see the majestic image of a Native American gazing over the Rock River Valley. This is no ordinary statue. It's a fifty-foot-tall reinforced concrete wonder that is awe-inspiring. The figure weighs more than half a million pounds, and is said to be the second largest monolithic concrete statue in the world. Sculptor Lorado Taft designed the statue as a tribute to all Native Americans, but it's more commonly associated with Chief Black Hawk.

And whether you're antiquing or not, Oregon, Illinois is worth a look. Just twenty-seven miles south of Rockford and ninety miles west of Chicago, it's often referred to as "the prettiest small town in America." The tree-lined streets are populated with picturesque Victorian homes, and in the center of downtown sits the venerable Ogle County Courthouse. Other Historical attractions abound in the area, including the nearby John Deere Historical Site - where Deere invented the self-polishing steel plow that that opened the prairie to agriculture.

The modern Blackhawk Center, just west of downtown Oregon, is host to the sixtyfive year-old Oregon Women's Club Antiques Show. The multi-use facility, a joint effort of the local school & park districts, is a terrific venue for the show, and quite an accomplishment for this town of just over 4,000.



And don't be fooled by the show's small-town location: you'll find quality antiques here, the dealers drawn by attendance that often exceeds that of the "big city" shows. Of course, the event is a mainstay for many Illinois dealers, including Country at Heart Antiques. They brought a huge inventory of the country Americana they're known for, from classic New England painted furniture to an early Vermont-found wooden barber pole. The American country theme continued in the nearby Robinson Ridge, who, brought, and quickly sold, a huge eight-foot-long primitive dry sink with a full-length zinc top.

Country not you thing? How about the great military memorabilia spanning the centuries shoppers found at Yesterday's Memories, or the amazing display of art glass & period silver-plate at Grape & Cable Antiques. In fact, you'll find dealers here specializing in everything from tools and toys to pottery, advertising, and more. Just take a look at the photos and you'll see what the show's all about.

Thanks to Oregon Women's Club for inviting me to the event. They said not to forget to mention the fantastic job that show manager Ron Bry did promoting the sixty-fifth edition of the event, attracting many new dealers to the show - and many new shoppers too. It's an important event for the Woman's Club. Each year the show brings in the lion's share of the funds they use throughout the year to benefit the community. Why not come out next year and have a look (and a piece of homemade pie from the Kiwanis Club food concession!) at the sixty-sixth edition of the Oregon Woman's Club Antiques Show. 


