Fertile Ground for Collectors at Fantastic Reed's Auction in Rural Kingston, Illinois

So what's not to like? Out on the farm in rural northern Illinois, surrounded by hundreds of country antiques. Tents filled with primitives and country accessories, tools, and the like. And just across the yard, past rows of farm artifacts and architectural fragments sat the big barn brimming with period American furniture. That was the scene at Jim & Maureen Little's farmstead just outside of Kingston, Illinois on May 30th, where an enthusiastic crowd of bidders from near & far came to join in on the fun.

You might know Maureen & Jim Little, for they've been active antiques dealers in the area for years. And, no, they're not quitting the business! Maureen told me that they just plain ran out of room for their ever-growing inventory, and decided to reduce it a bit to better focus on the old-paint furniture and primitives the couple is best known for.

Many came for a chance to bid on the large group of American country furniture. There was plenty to choose from too, ranging from primitive farm-made pieces to some nice country Sheraton pieces. That near 10'-long harvest table sporting a worn painted finish proved the winner of the bunch, bringing a solid \$775. A colorful two-tone dry sink did well too, selling for \$550. Other furniture highlights included a country pine corner cupboard that brought \$400, and a cherry wardrobe that crossed the block at \$350.

There was some choice advertising here as well. The biggest offering: a huge "Hannibal Cleaners" painted steel sign that saw competitive bidding and quickly

All in all, it was a good time for all, despite some intermittent rain. The Reed's Auction crew had erected tents to protect the bidders for the outdoor items, and the friendly crowd all squeezed into the barn when the furniture was sold. A group of first-time auction-goers came out too, encouraged by auctioneer Kyle Reed's helpful (and free) "Bidder 101" class he holds for newbies before every auction he conducts.





Minnesota State Fairgrounds Hosts Annual MADA Antiques & Decorative Arts Show

The Minnesota Antiques Dealers Association Antiques & Decorative Arts Show has been hosted by the Minnesota State Fairgrounds since its inception more than a decade ago. I earlier described the Fairgrounds as beautiful, and it truly is that. I first visited here several years ago, and my first impression was: what a difference from your typical fairgrounds! After passing under a large iron archway into the grounds, you're surrounded by what looks like the "streets of yesteryear," with tall trees shading the wide boulevards lined with lovely brick & stone buildings. It really is a pleasant place - and a busy one too! Be sure to stroll past the Art Deco/Art Moderne 4-H Building adjacent to the antiques show itself - and the nearby Art Deco Horticulture Building too. There are usually multiple events here on a typical summer weekend: both the GMCCA Car Show and the St. Paul Summer Beer Fest shared the fair-grounds with the MADA Antiques & Decorative Arts Show on this June 6th & 7th weekend. Another nice feature of the fairgrounds: plenty of parking adjacent to the venues, and free too!

The show itself is held in the Fine Arts Building, a grand old neoclassical brick structure. The huge open room is divided by dozens of freestanding white partition walls; giving the whole space the feel of a museum or art gallery. Each dealer has plenty of ready-made wall area for hanging objects, or just as a backdrop.

Those dealers ranged from Victorian to vintage to mid-century modern, or some-

The Twin Cities' premier consignment shop, H & B Gallery, had one of the largest exhibits at the show, bringing furnishings ranging from an 18th century Pennsylvania chest to a stylish Kent Coffey Mid-Century Modern dining room suite. And period advertising collectors surely weren't disappointed at what the show offered, most notably Steve Ketchum Antiques' display of brewery & distillery focused display.

Things couldn't have looked more different than at Country Gallery, where Scandinavian folk art is always the focus. Finds there included everything from painted 19th century wooden flax knives to an intricately carved 1767 Swedish bride's box. And there was great fine art all over the show as well - from the likes of Ron Christman Antiques & Art, White Crow Fine Paintings, and Main Street Galleries.

Show Committee chairperson Carol Eppel told me not to forget to mention the countless hours the other committee members worked putting together this 2015 show, with the help of many dedicated volunteers. You can contact the Minnesota Antiques Dealers Association through their website www.mnantiquesdealers.com. There, you'll find a member list, an application for membership, as well as a discount coupon for admission to their annual show. 






