





As you drive to Union, Illinois, site of the event, you might wonder how the world's biggest antique phonograph & music box show got here. The little town of Union is on Route 20 between Rockford & Chicago, hidden in the fertile cornfields of northern Illinois. Not exactly the first place you'd picture for a world-class specialty antique show!

You may also be a little surprised when you pull up to the show's venue and see the façade of an Old West town looming before you, for you've arrived at Donley's Wild West Town. It's part Wild West Show, part theme park, part exhibition and auction hall, and part museum - including an impressive antique phonograph collection. They've played host to the show from its very beginning, when Wild West Town's founder Larry Donley got a group of fellow antique phonograph collectors together here to buy, sell, and trade their wares two generations ago.

I don't even collect phonographs or music boxes, and this show is still one of my favorite events to cover. Maybe it's a guy thing. Antique phonographs offer the appeal of fine furniture, plus fascinating mechanisms to tinker with. And I can't think of any other antique that more literally brings the past alive than an antique phonograph playing music and voices recorded before the airplane - or even automobile, was invented.

As is true of many specialty antique shows, the dealers at the Antique Phonograph & Music Box Show are just "different" from your typical antiques dealer. I use the term dealer loosely, as most of them are collectors at heart. One longtime exhibitor told me: "For both the dealers and the shoppers, reconnecting with old friends is as an important part of the show as buying and selling. Some of these guys have been coming to Union, Illinois since the very first show, and have been friends for even longer than that." The dealers themselves came from all over the U.S. and Canada. Most have been attending the show for many years - some haven't missed any of the thirty-nine annual events.

Of course, nearly every major antique phonograph dealer in the nation was here,

with some of the finest and rarest examples you'll find anywhere - plus plenty of modestly-priced machines for us regular folks. Add to them the countless hobby dealers for whom this may be their main show of the year to buy, sell, and trade their favorite machines.

And many of the field's most noted authors and publishers come here each year too, with copies of their latest works. The photographs will give you a little glimpse of everything the show has to offer. Even if you're not an antique phonograph or music box collector, it's still well worth attending - you'll learn a lot, and get to see some of the world's finest examples of these fascinating mechanical wonders of the

I couldn't end the story without telling you a little more about the hosts of the show, the Donley family - owners of Wild West Town. Larry Donley, founder of Wild West Town, had already been collecting antique phonographs for some time when he obtained the lifetime collection of Clarence Ferguson more than forty years ago. Mr. Ferguson, the last Edison dealer in the United States, had also amassed an amazing collection of his own. Soon after the acquisition, Donley opened a small phonograph museum right here outside of Union, Illinois, and it's grown over the years into the twenty-acre complex that it is today.


Donley's Wild West Town is definitely worth the trip - even if you're not attending the Phonograph & Music Box Show. The kids will love Wild West Town itself, where they can be deputized and help round up the desperados. Or learn to rope from a real cowboy - even witness a shootout in the town square. It's geared towards the pre-teen crowd, something founder Larry Donley insists will never change. There's also an outdoor Wild West stage show that'll appeal to wanna-be cowboys of all ages. And the world-class Old West and Antique phonograph museums ensure that the older folks will have a great time too. Be sure to check out their Website www.wildwesttown.com. It'll help you plan an old-fashioned day-trip for the whole family. And as always, keep an eye out for next year's 41st Annual Phonograph & Music Box Show in the Auction Action Antique News!

The Society's website features a masthead showing a golf memorabilia collection. Three sections underneath give a brief overview of what the group is all about, a center section on recent news and a block for text style ads. This gives the homepage a nice, clean and uncluttered appearance, yet traditional in approach.

Links across the top take site visitors to various segments including a webzine section, resources, events, a forum, membership, faq, links, and how to contact the Society.

We like the well-thoughtout membership page which briefly explains and visualizes some of the member benefits, plus providing contact information and a membership form. The links page includes links to several other golf collecting associations.

The faq section (frequently asked questions) is very simple and yet, very helpful. This is a section that should be considered on every collecting club's website. It simply and briefly answers questions like: Who belongs? How do I determine the value of items? Are there Society shows that are open to the public? How do I determine when an item was made? Where can I get more information? etc.

By spending only a couple of minutes on the site, if a visitor has an interest in collecting or studying golf memorabilia, it would be hard to resist joining!







New Book Authored by ACC Co-founder

If you like antique automobiles, are interested in the early U.S. highways and byways, or enjoy presidential campaigns and the political artifacts they generate, this is all rolled up in one new book authored by Larry Krug, one of the founders of the Association of Collecting Clubs.

Entitled, "The Coolidge-Dawes Lincoln Tour 1924," the book is the story of the political caravan promoting the presidential campaign of Calvin Coolidge and his running mate, Charles G. Dawes. The book is compiled from eyewitness accounts. It was documented by E. A. Seidel, who drove the lead vehicle - a REO Speedwagon - and from newspaper accounts along the route, all illustrated with vintage photographs and political artifacts. Starting in Coolidge's hometown of Plymouth, Vermont, the caravan wound its way down to New York City, then followed the Lincoln Highway across the country to San Francisco, then along the Pacific Coast.

Over five million people turned out to witness the caravan as it rolled along 6,500 miles, much of it still unpaved, ranging from dirt in good weather to mud in bad weather, and involving over 100,000 vehicles! Along the way local bands played, horns honked, most of the cars were decorated in red, white and blue, and two million campaign buttons were distributed.

Civil War veterans who had voted for Abraham Lincoln were invited to sign a roster at the various stops and they turned out by the hundreds. National GOP dignitaries provided the rhetoric at the stops, making over 400 speeches promoting the re-election of Coolidge. The newspaper press along the route loved the event, proclaiming it the largest continuous procession of any kind in all history.

Krug has been a member of the Calvin Coolidge Memorial Foundation in Plymouth, Vermont, for over 30 years and assembled the broadest private collection of Coolidge political memorabilia in the country. 


