





Hundreds of Clocks and Much More at Two-Day Sweeney Auction in Waukon, Iowa

Well, one thing's for sure: Ray Sweeney liked clocks! Nearly fifty years ago, Ray bought out the huge "House of Clocks" collection from a fellow horologist in Spillville, Iowa and moved it to his nearby hometown of Waukon. He kept the House of Clocks name, and opened up his very own clock museum. Ray added greatly to the museum over the years, buying pretty much anything that interested him.

By the time he passed away more than twenty years ago, the popular roadside attraction housed everything from an early Sears & Roebuck Motor Buggy to a jukebox with mechanical band. Plus around a thousand clocks of all descriptions. He was also the founder of Waukon's Sweeney Auction Service, so I guess it was fitting that his collection was sold by Sweeney Auction, now run by some of his many children.

I always get a little excited as I travel to an antiques auction, never quite knowing what will turn up there. And the drive can be half the fun. That was true in spades as I headed toward Waukon in northeast Iowa, passing through Wisconsin's scenic Driftless Area before crossing the Mississippi River into the Hawkeye State.

I came for day-one of the sale, when most-everything but the clock collection crossed the block. A dozen wagon-loads of smaller items jostled for space in the huge building with hundreds of lots of furniture and country artifacts. Highlights ranged from a set of seven Rock Island Plows embossed steel signs bringing a total of \$3,000 to a Petty's Hog Tonic stoneware jug that fetched \$1,150.

The bidders moved into to House of Clocks Museum itself for day-two of the auction. That huge black Forest-style floor clock (with a twenty-seven pound mercury

pendulum) was the big winner at \$35,000. Several other clocks made well into five figures, including a classic Calumet Baking Powder advertising clock that brought \$3,000. A few notable non-clock lots sold on day-two as well, including an early Sears & Roebuck Motor Buggy that rolled off for \$8,000, and a funky AMI Jukebox that included a large add-on mechanical bandbox and sold for a surprising \$9,750.
