# Bidders Say Farewell to Little Norway Museum at Great August 15th Gavin Bros. Auction

In the more than half-a-century that Gavin Bros. Auctioneers has been in business, they've conducted many thousands of auctions. A few stand out from the rest. That was most certainly true of an August 15th sale they conducted in scenic Blue Mounds, Wisconsin: artifacts from the beloved Badger State tourist attraction called Little Norway. Held right on the grounds of the venerable living museum, the auction featured pieces displayed during Little Norway's seventy-five-years of operation. Examples ranged from period jewelry & textiles to the largest lot of the sale: a massive log stabbur (granary build-

ing) that sold for \$6,500!



# Scandinavian Relics Large & Small at Gavin Bros. Little Norway Museum Auction in Blue Mounds, Wisconsin

So, where's the perfect place to be on a sunny Wisconsin August morning? How about the grounds of the Little Norway Living Museum, nestled in the scenic wooded hills just outside of the village of Blue Mound. That was the setting for an August 15th Gavin Bros. auction, held to sell artifacts from the recently-closed cultural attraction.

I'm sure it was a bittersweet day for Little Norway's current owner Scott Winner, who was on hand to answer questions throughout the day. He literally grew up right on the grounds of the museum founded by his great uncle Isak Dahle in the 1930s. Dahle had purchased the farmstead a decade earlier - originally built by one of the many Norwegian immigrants that settled in this picturesque part of the state. Over the years he renovated the original farm buildings, filled them with antiques from Norway and America and eventually opened what has since been known as Little Norway.

But the crowning jewel of Little Norway, "The Norway Building," came from much farther away. The imposing structure is one of the few examples of Norse stave church architecture outside of Norway. Built in Trondheim, Norway for the Norway Pavilion at Chicago's 1893 World's Columbian Exposition, it was then moved to Lake Geneva, Wisconsin by a prominent Chicago tycoon after the exposition's closing.

After changing owners several times, The Norway Building fell into disrepair during the Great Depression. It was purchased by Little Norway founder Isak Dahle in 1935 and moved to the museum grounds where it was restored and has stood to this day. Not for long though! A group from Trondheim has purchased the iconic structure, and soon it will be disassembled for an ocean voyage back to the very town where it was built.

There were hundreds of artifacts left for the bidders though, waiting both under the big-top tent and all over the museum grounds. Vintage rosemaled objects (rosemal-

ing a stylized paint decoration popular in 18th & 19th century Norway) made by local artisans proved popular, with Telemark-style painted chairs fetching up to \$700 apiece. And of the authentic 19th century rosemaled pieces, a dated-1868 trunk in faded original paint was the winner at \$1,100. The historically-accurate Norwegian costumes worn by the museum's guides found ready buyers too, with the best examples selling for more than \$700.

All in all, it was a good time for everyone. I hope the photos give you a small idea of what you missed. The Gavin team did their usual terrific job handling the sale, with all the bidders on their way home by mid-afternoon.





Steve Strey is the 2015 WI State Champion Auctioneer, were you there - did you see the competition and were you part of the fun of bidding on unique items. The WI State Champion Auctioneer is held at the WI State Fair each year and this year on August 11, 2015 there were 18 competitors.

Steve Strey was awarded the honor of the 2015 WI State Champion Auctioneer by a panel of 5 judges, which included various past state champions and a Hall of Fame inductee. Steve finished the event by auctioning of not one but two of the octagon bricks for the 4-H Foundation benefit.

First Runner-Up was Jim Gavin from Reedsburg, WI and is associated with Gavin Brothers Auctioneers LLC and second runner-up was Dallas Kravoletz, Bonduel, WI. The other 3 finalists were Jeremy Schafer, Lake City, MN; Ray Henry of I.R.A.Y. Auction, Foley, MN; and Randy Stockwell of RJ Stockwell, Inc. Land & Auction Co., Dorchester, WI.

The competition was held on the Main Stage in the Coliseum of the WI State Fair Park. The competition entails an initial round where all the competitors sold 2 items and then determined by the judges scores the field was narrowed to 6 finalists. The six finalists then had to answer two industry related questions and sell an additional 3 items for the final round. This competition was also a fund raiser for the 4-H Foundation with the competitors selling various items donated for the 4-H Foundation.

Steve Strey, the 2015 WI State Champion wanted to be self-employed, so he went to auction school in 2002 at the Continental Auctioneer School in Mankato, MN in 2002. Steve grew up working on his grandparents dairy farms and purchased his own farm in 1998. Steve and his family currently farm near Foster, WI and has an 85 beef cow farm with 600 acres of crops. Steve has been married for 15 years to wife, Leslie and has one daughter Heidi who is 13.

Steve graduated from CVTC Farm Business and Production Management Course. He currently works with ProCountry Auctioneer Service selling farm machinery, livestock, real estate, construction equipment, antiques and collectibles. Steve is a partner with Scott Werlein; Scott was the 2009 WI State Auctioneer Champion. He is the past president of the Chippewa Valley Forage Council, past president of Grace Lutheran Church, current president of Eau Claire County Farm Bureau, member of the Augusta FFA Alumni.

# Sold Out Kalamazoo BB Gun Show Draws Dealers From Across the Country

It was a 3,000 mile one round trip for Terry Wittaker of Banner, Wyo., who didn't come to sell but to show off a jaw dropping collection of rare 1887 to 1923 Quackenbush air rifles, plus 1880s to 1920s cast metal targets. "I've been collecting for about 60 years, since age 10 or 11," said Wittaker, adding, "the more you poke, the more you find."

It was a bit shorter drive for George Mitchell, driving to Kalamazoo from Milburn, Iowa. He also was "showing only, but not selling," and covered several tables with 24-to 36-inch tall cardboard advertising signs featuring famed cowboy Red Ryder and others, all promoting BB guns from pre-and post-World War II eras. "I enjoy getting them out once a year," Mitchell said with a chuckle. "And I like looking at them as much as others do who visit the show."

Many folks came to the event with selling on their mind - and at least one entire collection being offered. Billy Joe Woods of Brighton, Mich., posted a sign stating "For Sale Daisy 1894 Collection" with a detailed list of items, "for a price of \$6,000." The 78-year-old collector noted his age and said family members not having an interest in his hobby as reasons for the sale. He quickly added, "oh I'll be back to visit the show."

Similar comments were made by 35-year veterans Gary and Jeanette Brockman of Dundee, Mich., who liquidated the remaining stock of their collection at the August event. "We've met so many wonderful people here over the years," Jeanette said with a smile. "And we even ended up with our photo in a toy book," said Gary. The two are shown with a table full of cap guns at an earlier Kalamazoo BB Gun Show featured in the newly published "Picker's Pocket Guide Toys" by Eric Bradley.

Many people setting up at the show were helped by family members. Bob Bocaccio and 9 year old grandson Josh drove more than eight hours from Holley, NY., to offer a 1930s Daisy Model 1129 BB rifle with "one side in good condition"

for \$45, and a "never opened box of plastic toy pea shooters" for the younger set.

"I've got a pretty helper," said Scott Evans of Monroe, Mich., pointing to his wife Dee. Advertising and BB gun collectors hovered over his early 1900s 3-by 5-inch folded paper piece for King BB guns priced at \$125. Toy collectors admired his 1950s Daisy Rocket Dart Pistol with original package and cardboard mounting board priced at \$375.

Show promoter Wes Powers was assisted by 17-year-old grandson Logan in showing off a 1923 Crosman "first model" pellet rifle that could be taken home for \$1,100. Powers also called attention to a Daisy prototype Quick-Kill rifle designed for training U.S. Vietnam War soldiers and priced at \$3,000.

"It took me 120 hours to restore it," said Larry Gibson of Portand Ind., pointing with pride to a pristine 1967 double-barreled Daisy Model 21 BB gun, complete with custom wood stock. "You can take it home for \$1,295," he said to a customer looking over his prize piece.

Benjamin air gun collectors checked out the examples shown by Dennis Baker of Mt. Victory, Ohio, which included a 310 model priced at \$150 and a model 392 tagged at \$250. The dealer said he offered about 75 different items at the Kalamazoo Fairgrounds event.

"We're pretty much all Daisys," said Larry Sutherland of Blissfield, Mich., looking over two display boards showing examples of many of the popular rifles. In all, the dealer offered 25 different examples priced from \$125 to \$300.


Toy cap guns and related items also are a popular part of the annual event.

Eighty-year-old dealer Patrick Keebey drove 10 hours from St. Peters, MO., to offer cap guns from the 1950s and 60s priced from \$60 to \$250 each. His toy Ohio Art tin Carnival Shooting Gallery could be taken home for \$100.

It'll be 2016 before the group meets again in Kalamazoo with a tentative date sometime in August. The annual gathering will also celebrate its 25th anniversary in two years, with promoter Powers saying there will be a celebration at that time. 
