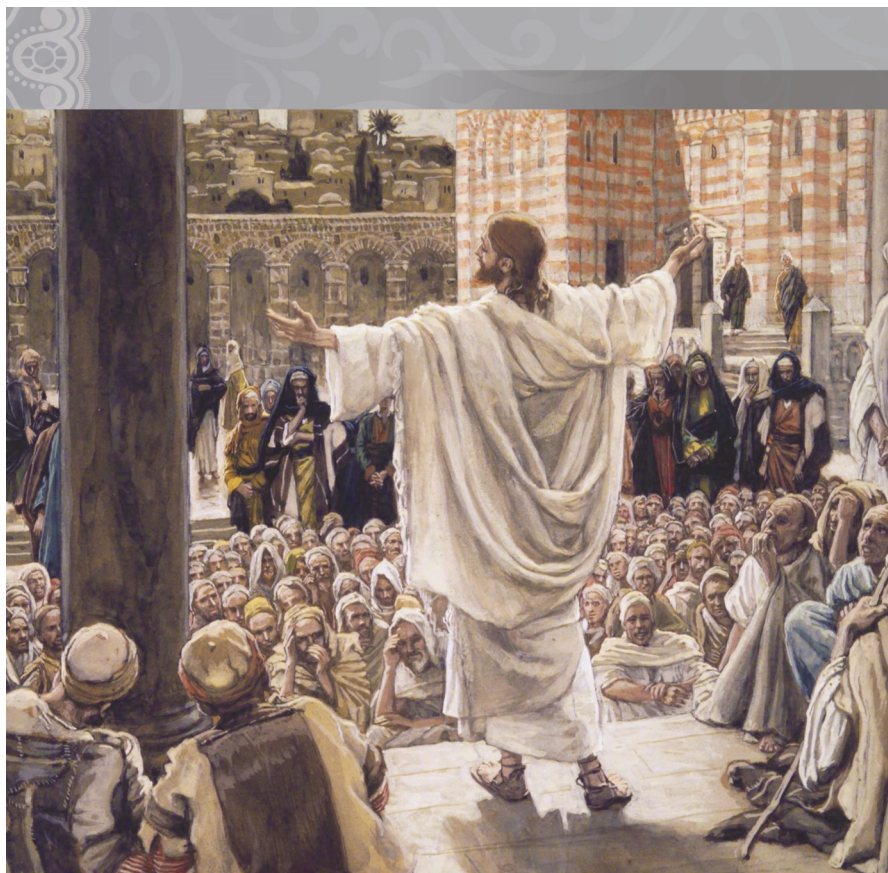

From the Desk of Father George

Greetings everyone,

As we have begun the second half of August, school bells are beginning to ring for students and parents alike. Returning to school schedules is often greeted with mixed emotions... for it means sacrificing the freedom of summer days and the re-setting of alarm clocks. Depending upon how you view this shift, it can be either a welcome relief or a burden to be endured. Perhaps the best advice is to set one's sights on what is to be gained versus what is to be lost.

The prophet Jeremiah found himself in a similar state of existence. His message of reform to the people of Judah was a way that they could escape punishment and exile. Unfortunately, King Zedekiah's advisors persuaded him to revolt against the Babylonian oppressors. Eventually Judah was destroyed as an independent state, Jerusalem was laid to waste, and the Israelites were hauled off into exile in 587. Indeed, it was a sad day for not having heeded the messenger or trusted in God's prophet.

While Jesus' message in the Gospel may shock us, it is filled with a hopefulness of who we are and our role as persons of faith. Standing up for our beliefs can bring controversy but caving into popularity replays the destruction of Judah and ultimately delivers us into a bondage that can deny God. If we choose to be 'fired up' by God's Word, to be faithful to the baptism we have received, and to seek the mercy, reconciliation and peace of the Gospel, then we will be united to one another as sons and daughters of God, brothers and sisters in Christ. If not, then we are responsible for casting stones at the Son of God and His message.

As the week unfolds and alarm clocks ring out, remember to hear the voice of the prophets and to embrace the role of discipleship. It is a great way to begin a new school year as well as re-setting our personal compasses of faith.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is the time to think about inviting your family and friends to consider full membership in the Catholic Faith. The RCIA will once again convene in late summer or early fall. This is an opportunity for those who have never been: baptized, those baptized outside the Catholic Church, or those baptized Catholic who have never received the sacrament of Holy Eucharist; to be baptized, profess their belief in the Catholic faith or to complete the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are an adult who has never been Confirmed, there is a separate process to complete your initiation. Either way, call Fr. George, 327-1978.
