# From the Desk of Father George

Greetings Parishioners and friends of St. Julie's,

Have faith! It is a message that we hear repeatedly throughout the Sacred Scriptures. And yet, what does it really mean?

The prophet Habakkuk spoke the lesson of faith during a period of great struggle. Like his prophetic colleagues, he mediated on behalf of his people in times that tried their faith. It was a time of political uncertainty, and the Israelites were searching for answers through foreign alliances, stronger armies and numerous treaties. Habakkuk tried to assure them that the true answer resided in their faith that God would never leave them. His promise to the believers was that the just would live because of their faith.

St. Paul's Letter to Timothy also reminds all believers that faith is God's gift, and so must be treasured. It must be unwrapped to become evident. It must be tended so that it will not disappear and leave us in despair when desperate times befall us. Faith is a way of life every day. Perhaps the Gospel says it best as Jesus replies to the apostles' request for their faith to be increased. Jesus says: "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you."

How greatly do we value and rely upon our faith? Think of a recent moment when it brought you comfort to know that God had not forgotten you or that God had forgiven you. How did it feel? Where and when have you needed an even stronger faith? Ask God for that gift and place it into practice before it may be too late.

Speaking of faith and forgiveness, the Jewish Feast of Yom Kippur is Wednesday - October 9<sup>th</sup>. It is their Highest Holy Day of the year and is a reminder of God's love and forgiveness as well as the need to atone for sins. Pray for our brothers and sisters in their journey of faith.
