

From the Desk of Father George

Greetings parishioners and friends of St. Julie's,

We often hear that to be a person of faith means that we must have a relationship with God... a point that readily opens us to the ongoing discovery of God's love for us. Living in a relationship with God also means that we live in commitment to the commandments and the laws of love. The Scriptures for this Sunday call us to faithfulness... not only in what we do but, in our perseverance, as well.

During the long battle with Amalek, if Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage in battle. St. Paul encourages the recipients of his letter to remain faithful to the teachings they received and the power to preach through the living Christ. Even the judge within the Gospel - while settling for the wrong reasons - recognizes perseverance in the plea.

Being faithful often involves sacrifice as well as persecution. Every day we can find ourselves challenged to be the persons who enliven others with faith as well as hope. It can be uncomfortable or even difficult, but through our commitment to prayer and openness to God's will, we will find our way. Spend some time this week talking to God about one event or challenge. Ask for openness to hear Him speak and be willing to sit patiently to understand the call to respond through His grace.
