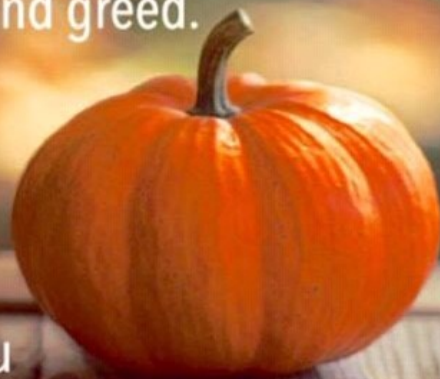
Human Development
