

#### From the Desk of Father George

Greetings Parishioners and friends of St. Julie's,

As the Advent Wreath glows brighter with another flame, the prophet Isaiah proclaims the dawning of a new age - 'a shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a bud shall blossom.' The Messiah will bring peace and justice, and all shall seek his dwelling. It is a message repeated in greeting cards and in the dreams of the hearts of many. But, how can we turn a message into reality? How can this Advent become one of greater love and joy?

John the Baptist supplies the answer. The theme of his preaching was: "Reform your lives!" It is still a message that reaches to the depths of our very being. Bless the name of the Lord whom we celebrate by letting go of sinful ways and making every effort to be who we are... a child of God by the grace of Baptism.

#### 40 Days for Life Fall 2016 Campaign - Final Results:

It takes a few weeks for all the results to come in from around the world for a 40 Days for Life campaign. The great news is that the incredible final results from the Fall 2016 Campaign are worth the wait!!! From September 28 through November 6, there were 872 babies' lives saved that we know of. This means that since the first 40 Days for Life in 2007, there have been reports of 12,668 babies saved from death by abortion and thousands of moms and dads who can rejoice in choosing life!!! In addition to babies saved, there were also 8 more abortion workers who had a change of heart and left the abortion industry during the Spring Campaign. 141 workers in all have left since 2007! And there were 5 more abortion facilities that closed, for a total of 75 abortion facilities that have closed since 2007!
