Collection for the Church in Latin America

For over 50 years, the Collection for the Church in Latin America has been an expression of the solidarity of the Church in the United States with the Church in Latin America and the Caribbean. In a letter celebrating this important anniversary, Pope Francis commended this work, saying, "Through your support many lives have been touched by the Good News of Christ's merciful love, especially for the poor." Your participation in the collection helps share the faith with those who long to experience God's mercy and compassion in strong faith communities.

In northern Peru, great distances and deteriorated roads mean that pastoral agents and ministers must often travel by foot or mule to rural communities. As a result, some communities are visited by these church agents only once per month, others sometimes just twice per year. The Collection for the Church in Latin America was able to help fund training for 65 pastoral ministers for some of these communities. Because of your support, these new leaders continue to reach out and serve the rural areas. ensuring all feel included in our family of faith. Through projects like this, you are helping empower the people of Latin America and the Caribbean to deepen their faith and share it with the world.
