

Greetings parishioners and friends of St. Julie's,

As I glanced at the calendar this week, it is hard to believe that March is nearly half gone. However, the joyful news is that **spring arrives next Monday** - **March 20**th, and it will already be the third full week of Lent. So, "How's your Lent?" Are the disciplines of this season taking hold? Have the words of Ash Wednesday - "Repent and believe in the Gospel" - begun to take root? While Easter is still a long way off, it's never too late to get on the path to the Great Feast of His Resurrection.

Today's Matthean Gospel is the well-known Transfiguration of Jesus. Key to our understanding the passage is to hear what Peter, James and John heard: "Listen to Him." How often have we heard those words when being challenged to discipleship? They were words spoken from the cloud that transcend time. Jesus has the words of truth, light and life that transform the lives of those who listen to him. We have heard the words of forgiveness, charity, compassion and justice. But have they registered? Will this season of Lent transform us to be ever more closely united with the Risen Christ?

Make Lent a time of special effort! Celebrate His love in your life by going the extra mile to do something more rather than less.
