

5th Sunday of Lent

From the Desk of Father George

Greetings Parishioners and Friends of St. Julie's.

As we head into week five of Lent, there are many stirrings in preparation for Holy Week. Today's Gospel - yet another favorite of mine - is the raising of Lazarus from the dead. Jesus weeps. Martha professes her belief that Jesus is the Messiah, and Mary proclaims the work of Jesus. Meanwhile... Lazarus is raised from the dead. Whew! What a day that must have been in Bethany!

Having been to the well with The Woman of Samaria, and last week traveled from inquiry to inquiry with The Man Born Blind, we arrive at a familiar scene... the grave of someone who has died. How many times have we stood at the grave of someone we have loved? What sort of thoughts and emotions filled us up? Did we weep? Did we walk away numb? Did we commend them to the Lord and the resurrection on the last day?

Connecting ourselves to the faith we celebrate can alter our experiences of living. Jesus invites us to receive his love and consolation wherever we stand, wherever we go, and in whatever happens. I have always wondered what dinner was like that evening in Bethany as Martha, Mary and Lazarus (and probably Jesus) looked back at the day. While a gift was returned for a time (Lazarus coming back to life), all of them would die – but not forever. Jesus' resurrection changed all that... for them and for us. Do you believe?

Remember the lessons of these last three Sundays: Jesus is the living water who offers life in abundance to each and every one of us; Jesus is the light of the world who leads us out of darkness and frees us from sin; and Jesus is the resurrection and the life - for whoever believes in Him, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who believes in Him will never die.

Next week is Palm Sunday. Plan to arrive a few minutes early to Mass so as to be present for the blessing of palms and the opening procession.
