From the Desk of Father George

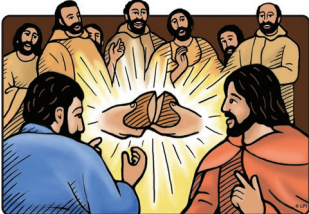
Greetings Parishioners and friends of St. Julie's,

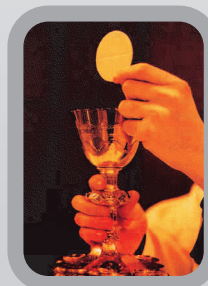
