

Greetings Parishioners and friends of St. Julie's,

While spring blooms (and pollen) fill the air, the church environment continues to be bright and colorful announcing that Jesus has risen from the dead. In this Holy Easter Season, the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles repeatedly tells the story of Jesus' resurrection and the conversion of those who hear the Good News. Each of us should continue to rejoice as an Easter people.

In today's gospel, Jesus calls himself the 'gate,' the entry way, for us to God... the 'door' through which we step from the reality of our imperfect, incomplete world to the reality of the perfect holiness of God. 

# 40 Days for Life Spring 2017 Campaign -

Final Results: It takes a few weeks for all the results to come in from around the world for a 40 Days for Life campaign. The great news is that the incredible final results from the Spring 2017 Campaign are worth the wait!!! From March 1 through April 9, there were 637 babies' lives saved that we know of. This means that since the first 40 Days for Life in 2007, there have been reports of 13,305 babies saved from death by abortion and thousands of moms and dads who can rejoice in choosing life!!! In addition to babies saved, there were also 13 more abortion workers who had a change of heart and left the abortion industry during the Spring Campaign. 154 workers in all have left since 2007! And there were 10 more abortion facilities that closed, for a total of 85 abortion facilities that have closed since 2007!
