



CCHD is Funding Exciting Projects in 2017!

The generosity of parishioners throughout the Diocese of Cleveland makes it possible to award local grants through the Catholic Campaign for Human Development. CCHD works to change the structures and systems that keep people in poverty.

This year, Community Grants, Youth and Young Adult Grants, and a Fr. David Fallon Award will be presented to parishes and organizations that are working to empower people to build better communities, alleviate poverty, and promote the values of Catholic Social Teaching.

STJBC Family Promise

Working with IHN (Interfaith Hospitality Network) of Lorain County, St. Julie Billiart's Family Promise hosts guest families who are homeless. STJBC Family Promise will host for one week stretches, three times per year. During that week of hospitality, the parish provides dinner each evening, overnight accommodations, breakfast, and bag lunches each day to the guests. These families that participate in the program have the goal to obtain a permanent residence and the skills necessary to maintain the family and the residence. Other social services are available to help family members move toward self-sufficiency. St. Julie's will use the award funds to purchase good quality cots for the guests.
