From the Desk of Father George

Greetings Parishioners and Friends of St. Julie's,

For many, the school bells have begun to ring, and another busy year for families and college students is falling into place. In many ways summer seems to be at an end - although the calendar still offers us four more weeks. Cheer up however; it will still be many weeks before the first snow begins to fly in our part of the state. Best wishes to all students - wherever you may be going... from pre-school to college... may this year be one of great adventure, hopefulness and learning.

In today's gospel, Jesus asks the disciples: "Who do you say that I am?" It is a question that has rung throughout the ages in many different ways. The late John Paul II reflected upon the heart of today's gospel in 1978 when he was elected Pope. He said: "In the course of two thousand years, these words, 'You are Peter,' have been spoken 264 times to the ears and conscience of a fragile and sinful man... The last in time, it was to me that the promise of Caesarea Philippi was repeated and it is in the office of Peter that I am in your midst... With what message? The same one that Peter proclaimed. Peter, ardent but fearful, the friend, the renegade, the penitent... the Peter who received the Holy Spirit proclaimed to the world: 'God has made this Jesus... both Lord and Christ'... all that the successor of Peter must say is contained in these simple words: "God has made Jesus both Lord and Christ!"

Are not each of us called to testify in a similar fashion? Peter's response is the statement by which we too should journey. It is not so much a matter of "who" we are as it matters "whose" we are. If we already belong to Jesus, we have an identity and a purpose in life that is secure from ever being lost or stolen. Invite the message to direct your lives this week. Encourage a student, teacher or family member to embrace the response in all they think, say and do.

The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) will once again convene in late summer or early fall. This is an opportunity for those who have never been: baptized, those baptized outside the Catholic Church, or those baptized Catholic who have never received the sacrament of Holy Eucharist; to be baptized, profess their belief in the Catholic faith or to complete the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are an adult who has never been Confirmed, there is a separate process to complete your initiation. Either way, call Fr. George, 327-1978.
