

### From the Desk of Father George

Greetings Parishioners and friends of St. Julie's,

#### FORGIVENESS:

The act of excusing a fault or offense; to pardon.

To renounce anger or resentment against another.

How often have we been challenged to not only understand the definition of this simple word, but to also act upon it? The scriptures for this weekend clearly remind us that we can expect no mercy unless we ourselves are willing to extend mercy to others.

Our reading from the book of Sirach begins with the following: "Wrath and anger are hateful things, yet the sinner hugs them tight. The vengeful will suffer the Lord's vengeance, for he remembers their sins in detail." It makes one think about the consequences of a hardened heart. Jesus tells Peter: "to forgive not seven times but seventy-seven times... and to forgive our brother from our heart."

No matter how well we think we might be doing, there might always be that subtle anger which stills burns within us. Take time to pray for a more generous heart to forgive as well as to understand the mercy of God for us. So often we might only think about the Sacrament of Reconciliation in Advent or Lent... but the Sacrament is available every Saturday from 4:00 until 4:30 in the Library (located next to the PSR office).
