From the Desk of Father George

Dear Parishioners and friends of St. Julie's,

As autumn scents of dying plants and drying leaves begin to fill the air, we are reminded that many harvests are taking place. Our gardens have just about given their all and it will soon be time to clear the patios and store the summer hoses, chairs and umbrellas away for the winter. There is nothing like the smell of a distant fire pit or burning leaves to fill the cool night air!

Today's Scripture passages utilize a very familiar crop for the people of their day - vineyards and their grapes. Of course, it is not literally about the wine or the fruit. Rather, it is about what each may symbolize for the author. Israel is the choice vineyard of the Lord - and yet it produced wild grapes! The people of Judah forgot God's love and turned to ways not of the Lord. In a similar fashion, the Matthean Parable of the rebel tenants and the vineyard also points at those who did not produce fruit worthy of their vines. At the appointed time the rebels will be cast out and others will take their place. In other words, the Kingdom of God will be given to a people that will produce its fruit. We have been offered that opportunity to tend the vineyard and bring the Kingdom of God to others. How well are we holding to the task of our Baptismal Promises? How often have we exercised our life in the Eucharist? Can others recognize if we are consistently faithful in our efforts to proclaim Christ to the world?

While many families buzz with activities throughout the year, things accelerate with fall sports, school activities and yearnings to catch the 'last days of summer'. Enjoy, and be safe with God!

October 2, 2017
