

From the Desk of Father George

Greetings Parishioners and friends of St. Julie's,

This weekend, the Good News comes to us in the form of yet another parable. Today, it is the wedding feast given by a king for his son. True to the tradition of many Matthean parables, it begins with: "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to..." telling us something special about the kingdom in terms of a story. This parable is also special in that it contains a parable within a parable... for the ending of the long version tells us how we must prepare ourselves.

In short, we are all invited. The feast is not something we catch on the run, but rather something of tremendous love offered to us... everything has been provided. However, we often reject God's invitation – or try to put it off until another day or time. Even so, can we come to the table of God's children in heaven not having prepared ourselves? Can we hope to be welcomed in when we have not clothed ourselves in compassion, forgiveness, understanding and love? Although our God is generous – as indicated by the sizable feast of the parable, we cannot bank only upon the invitation. Our having heard the Good News and having incorporated it into our lives is the measure or our readiness. "Many are invited, but few are chosen."
