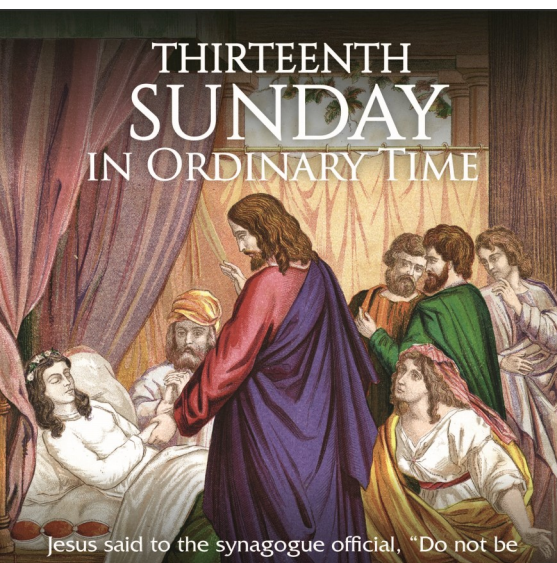

Greetings Parishioners and friends of St. Julie's,

Having crossed again to the other side of the lake, the synagogue official named Jairus falls to the feet of Jesus and pleads for the health of his daughter who is at the point of death. Before Jesus can arrive at Jairus' house, people arrived to say that the girl has died and that it is too late... but Jesus has other plans! He raises the little girl from the dead and restores her to her parents. Of course, they were all astounded... but who wouldn't be?

I'm sure that many of us have prayed that it not be true when we receive the unexpected news of someone's death. We use phrases like: "I can't believe he/she is gone" or an "Oh, No!" in utter anguish. It is normal to feel that pain and more. If we had no pain, how would we know we had loved?

Today's Gospel miracle can speak to us in many ways. Jesus is the Son of God - recognized and revered by the synagogue official. Jesus once again encourages an embrace of faith... and Jesus finds himself first mocked and then held in astonishment. How have you revered Him this week? Where has the gift of faith enabled you to face a difficult task or make a difficult decision... to trust that God is there! How have you doubted what God can do?

Recognizing the love of God and Christ among us is not a difficult task. It simply takes faith... the same faith that raised the synagogue official's daughter from the dead. Is the love of Christ in your heart? Do you make decisions out of love or out of fear of punishment? Pray this week for the grace to be filled with grace.

During this Ordinary Time of the year, listen carefully to the Scriptures. They offer us the occasion to reflect trust of God in our own lives and to be bearers of that message to all we meet. Don't let summer pass you by without expanding your arsenal of faith!
