In today's first reading we hear: "Forsake foolishness that you may live." (Prv 9: 6) Can one think of better words of advice when it comes to things that matter in life?" For many years I was acquainted with the mother of a very good friend. Her favorite phrase was: "That's foolishness!" She could always cut to the quick to make her point or place someone more closely in line with her thoughts or her view.
