From the Desk of Father Franco

Dear Friends and Parishioners of St. Julie's,

Though PSR does not begin until October 6, I encourage you to make sure your children are signed up. I also echoed Kelly Reed's plea for PSR teachers. If you are gifted, able and sense this is something God wants you to do, please give Kelly a call. The PSR teachers will be joining Kelly for their annual retreat day on September 23^{rd} . Please pray for them as they seek to serve the children of St. Julie Parish.

Beginning next Sunday evening, September 23 at 7:00 PM, the joint parish mission of Ss. Peter and Julie Parishes begins. Fr. Dave Pivonka TOR will be leading the three day mission at St. Peter Parish. The theme is simply *Alive in the Spirit*. The Sunday evening program will include the Sacrament of Penance. The Monday evening program will include Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. And the Tuesday evening program will conclude with the celebration of the Mass.

Fr. Dave has been given permission from his community to do itinerant preaching work, putting on parish missions and retreats across the country and beyond. He has also walked The Camino (the pilgrimage walk to Santiago de Compostela in Spain. Some of Fr. Dave's work may be viewed on *The Wild Goose is Loose*, which can be viewed online at <u>www.formed.org</u> and other online venues.

I know that this parish mission is normally in Lent. However, the earliest I could book Fr. Dave Pivonka in 2018 was in the fall. So our joint parish mission was delayed six months. However, look at this this way: the weather is normally better than Lent and the fall is sort of the startup time for many things in the life of a parish. Hope to see you there at St. Peter Parish. Please note: the parish mission will be in the St. Peter gym.

In today's gospel Peter goes from hero to goat in less than 30 seconds. He was rightly inspired to identify Jesus as the Christ, the Messiah and savior of the world. However, just after Jesus described the mission of the redeemer (to suffer, die and rise), Peter tried to talk him out of it! Jesus did not mince words: Get behind me, Satan! What was Peter's big mistake? He was thinking, not as God does, but as human beings do.

As human beings we are inclined to the path of least resistance. We naturally turn from the cross and "go with the flow." As Christians we are more often than not called to stand against the tide, not go with the flow!

St. Paul reminds that we are to become a "living sacrifice". (Romans 12:1) So he instructs us: Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind...(Romans 12:2) Learning to think as God does mean's unlearning the ways of the world. Then we will not be squeezed into the mold of the world. Instead, we will be transformed to think and speak and act as disciples of Jesus Christ.
