

From the Desk of Father Franco

Dear Friends and Parishioners of St. Julie's,

Next weekend St. Julie's will be hosting two special events. First, there will be a Spaghetti Dinner on Saturday, October 27 immediately after the 5:00 PM Mass. Tickets will be sold at the door and dessert is included. Needless to say, all are welcome.

The second special event will be a video a five minute video that will be shown before all the Masses. The video shows the impact that St. Pope Paul VI's document Humanae Vitae had on a OB/GYN doctor, and through him how this document changed the lives of many other people. I encourage you to come early and take in this short but compelling video. Sorry, no popcorn!

I will be leaving this Sunday, October 21 on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. I will be the spiritual director for a group of 27 other pilgrims. Most of the group is from St. Peter Parish. We will be exploring the places where Jesus lived, taught, worked miracles, as well as where he suffered, died and rose from the dead. Early next week we will be in the area around the Sea of Galilee visiting places like Nazareth, Cana and Capernaum. Later in the week and into next week, our pilgrimage will spend time in Jericho, Bethlehem, the Dead Sea and (of course) Jerusalem. I ask for your prayers for our group. And I want to assure you of my prayers for you.

Our readings today focus on Jesus as the Suffering Servant. Our first reading is a portion of Isaiah 53, a chapter that is read completely at the Good Friday Liturgy. Isaiah writes...through is suffering, my servant shall justify many...The words of Jesus in the gospel of Mark highlight this same message. Jesus tells us... For the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many.

The message is clear. Jesus Christ came into this world to save sinners. Out of love he laid down his life for us. Through Him we have forgiveness of sins and new life. And equally clear from his message is that we must imitate his servant leadership for...whoever wishes to be great among you shall be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all.
