From the Desk of Father Franco

Dear Parishioners,

The National Catholic Schools Week begins next Sunday, January 27. I know that in the past St. Julie parishioners have had students in St. Peter Catholic School. I invite families who have an interest in a Catholic elementary school education to visit the St. Peter Parish School Open House next Sunday, January 27 anytime from 7:00 AM to 1:00 PM. As Mr. Brooks, principal and alumni of St. Peter School, often says, "Come and see why we are the difference."

- Monday, January 21: This is Martin Luther King Day. As our nation honors him who labored non-violently for civil rights, may we root out the vestiges of prejudice that erode our humanity.

Today's gospel is Jesus' first miracle: changing water into wine. Near the end of the gospel passage St. John records that *Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs*. Signs are things that point beyond themselves. They convey a message. A red octagon with the letters S-T-O-P commands us to stop. If we see the *Golden Arches* we know where we can get a Big Mac. **Signs communicate a message.**

What did changing water into wine communicate? I do not think Jesus was promoting drinking to excess. He was not simply bailing out newlyweds who miscalculated their need for wine. Changing water into the best of wines tells us of God's plan.

In one sense, the human race had run out of wine. In our world, the human race was supposed to walk with God. It was to be a world of justice and joy. However, because we sinned against God, death entered the world and the wine ran out. With the coming of Jesus Christ, we have wine in abundance. The good wine had been kept until now.

St. John tells us that with this sign, Jesus began to reveal his glory. His disciples *began to believe in Him*. Let us follow their lead. In spite of the difficulties and even tragedies of this world, we have Jesus Christ. Because of his victory over death and sin, we have unshakable hope, unconquerable love and a faith that gives us purpose and meaning. Let us keep believing.

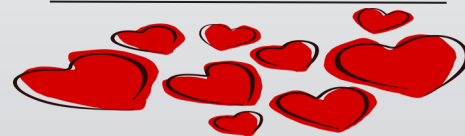

This Tuesday marks the 46th anniversary of the January 22, 1973 U.S. Supreme Court decisions that legalized abortion throughout all nine months of pregnancy. In forty-six years, over 60 Million American babies have been killed by abortion, and many women and men have been harmed by participating in abortion.
