On 17th October, the "Life in the Spirit" Prayer Group based at the Parish of St Joan of Arc Farnham celebrated its 35th anniversary. It has been meeting weekly with almost no breaks since 1980. Thirty six present and past members of the group and their guests gathered in the Parish Centre for a shared lunch and a chance to catch up with each other.



Alastair Emblem, who has led since 1992, gave the following quick history of the group since its foundation, followed by greetings from former members and others from the Catholic Charismatic world who have helped the group over the years. A time of joyful praise and worship was followed by a talk on the "Joy of the Gospel" by former prayer group member Carol Harnett, now a trainer of catechists. She encouraged everyone to pay attention to the powerful teaching of Pope Francis in his Exhortation "Evangelii Gaudium". She pointed out that each of us needs to deepen our personal relationship with Jesus, so that, as a joyfilled and welcoming community, we can be more effective witnesses of God's love. The afternoon ended with tea, a time of Adoration, and evening Mass in the Church.



These are some brief highlights of this prayer group over the last 35 years. This will be a nostalgia trip for some of us oldies, and hopefully an interesting history lesson for newer people:

The group was started approximately 35 years ago by former PP Fr Michael "Smiler" Albon RIP 1981. He apparently had a sign on his study wall reading "JOY" – Jesus first; Others second; Yourself last. Joy has always been a foundation of our group, with a strong emphasis on praise in all our meetings. We are delighted that Joy is such a strong theme of Pope Francis.

From early 1984 the group was hosted and led by Peter and Margaret Lloyd till 1991



In summer 1984 Alastair & Jenny joined the group



The group formed the prayer support for the Parish participation in the Diocesan Renew programme 1988-90.




In Autumn 1991 Fr Jim Martin became Parish Priest and allowed us to use the Church Sacristy for meetings.



April-May 1992 we ran the first Life in the Spirit Seminars jointly with Holy Family parish at Heath End.


Around that time, Alastair took over leadership




In 2001 Canon Tony Whale became Parish Priest and allowed us to meet in the Presbytery sitting room. In 2009, thanks to Fr Tony, the new Parish Centre opened and since then our regular weekly meetings have been in the Foyer room.



Most years we put on some sort of faith deepening course for the wider parish and beyond: Numerous different versions of Life in the Spirit;



Alpha and Cafe courses; Healing Ministry Training;



...and 2 Parish Missions in 1996 and 2013



Other courses, Taize evenings, Holy Hours, Healing services, ecumenical services

Numbers have fluctuated constantly over the years. A couple of times we have reached a high as 21 but currently we seem to average out at between 9 and 12. For a long time we simply referred to ourselves as the Parish prayer group, because we were the only one. And although at heart we have always been a charismatic prayer group, for many years we were a bit shy about being too overt, for fear of putting people off.

But recent years have thankfully seen the development of a Rosary Group, a Mothers Prayers group, Healing Ministry and a Christian Meditation Group. When Fr Niven came 3 years ago we were encouraged to be more forthcoming about our charismatic nature. Around that time we started calling ourselves the Life in the Spirit prayer group. And of course we are delighted that Pope Francis is so enthusiastic about charismatic renewal.






