Spring Safety Tips

Safety Tips at Home

- Replace door screws to at least 3 inches to solidify the integrity of your door.
- Check smoke detectors and replace batteries.
- Clean the lint trap in your dryer to prevent fires.
- Parents know the law concerning young children home alone such as latch key kids. Children aged 8 through 12 may be left alone for brief periods but must have support systems in place, such as phone numbers of parents, other family members or neighbors, information about personal safety, and what to do in an emergency. Children in this age group may not be left to care for children under the age of eight.
- Keep doors and cars locked, especially at night, in order to prevent theft and protect your home and property.
