Based on some minor changes in the purchase contract, we are in agreement to sell the property. 



"NEWS FROM OUR CHURCHES"

Antioch: Our Pastor prepared us for Christmas with a message series on the "Fear Not's of the Nativity." We began a four-part series on "The Jew" during Wednesday Bible Study this month. The church is fervently praying for Charles Elliott who is recovering from another cancer surgery. Our DOM, Daryl Stagg, filled the pulpit December 21 while our pastor and wife visited family in warm, sunny Florida for Christmas.

Bethany: The saints at Bethany filled up the calendar in December! There were Christmas parties and fellowship times for children, teens, men and ladies. One of our charter members, Ellen Mickens, celebrated her 90th birthday. We went caroling on the 17th. We enjoyed a musical Christmas program, "Prepare Him Room," during our 6:00 pm evening service on the 21st. We shared our annual Christmas Eve Service at 5:00 pm, followed by a Come and Go Fellowship at Craig and Joanie's.

<u>Calvary:</u> The Celebration of Music by the choir was presented under the direction of Judy King. After the service a Retirement Dinner for Pastor Ted and Judy was held in Fellowship Hall. It was a great time of fellowship with family and friends. That evening many members went caroling. We would like to wish everyone a Blessed Christmas. To our Pastor as he retires we love and appreciate all you have done for our church. We will miss you and Judy, but look forward to what God has in store for us and His church. The Pastor Search Committee is working to search for a pastor.

Camp Branch: The Women's Bible Study will begin a Precept study of the book of Revelation beginning Thursday, January 8. A workbook is required so early registration is encouraged. Emmet Avenue: We collected items and delivered a total of 30 shoeboxes for the Operation Christmas Child Program. In December we delivered 10 fruit baskets for Christmas to our shut-ins. <u>Flat Creek</u>: On December 7 after the morning service we enjoyed the Holiday Meal with good fellowship. We continue to collect food for Open Door and have delivered over 5,000 cans of vegetables to them.

We delivered bags of cookies and "Case For Christ" DVDs to 55 families in our Neighborhood Cookie Distribution on December 7. We hosted the Pastors' Christmas Dinner on December 13. The Senior Adult Group presented the Christmas Play, "Cricket Country Christmas Charity" on December 14 during morning worship. We went Christmas Caroling to Shut-Ins and to the residents of Fairview Nursing Home on December 14. Jeff Page led a service for the residents of Fairview Nursing Home on December 28. We served a meal at Community Café on December 31. We gathered for our annual New Year's Eve Party in Fellowship Hall on December 31 until midnight, followed by a Youth Lock-In.

Memorial: Kids Care, directed by Mrs. Lonnie DeVorss, presented the Christmas Story on December 14. The children that participated did an excellent job. After the play the church family exchanged Christmas cards and some gifts. God is truly blessing and moving within our church family. We are eternally grateful for all that God is doing. The church will have its holiday meal the first Sunday in January.

New Hope: The Women's Ministry worked on a doll project in November and December in which they put together doll ensembles to be given to children in crisis situations. Each ensemble included a basket with a doll, several outfits, blanket, knit stocking cap, and other accessories such as bottles, diapers, socks, key rings, teething rings, feeding spoons, and a tiny doll or stuffed animal. Six dolls were delivered to CASA and the remaining 21 were donated to the Community Santa Campaign. Our Christmas Eve Candlelight Service was Tuesday, December 24, at 6:00 pm. An All-Church Christmas Breakfast was held during the Sunday School hour on December 28 at 9:30 am. Our Winter Bible Study *Deuteronomy: A Challenge to a New Generation* will be held each Sunday in January and February after the worship service. A Soup and Sandwich Lunch will be served.

<u>Providence</u>: We set a goal of \$500 for Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. We met the last four Sundays at 4:00 to practice for Christmas program. 
