“NEWS FROM OUR CHURCHES”

Bethany: The saints at Bethany launched a summer of outreach! We started June with a week of VBS. We began our 12th summer of serving at Sagrada Scholarship Bible camp, providing counselors, van transportation, and leadership. We joined the Open Door and a few neighborhood churches to serve lunches to neighborhood kids at Hubbard Park this summer. Our mission team continues to prepare for a trip back to the Haiti Home of Hope Orphanage in early August. Our men (of all ages) started off Father's Day with the annual "Men & Boys Breakfast."

Broadway: We continue our Sunday evening video presentations of false teachers and false religions. Upcoming programs include Yoga and Oprah's New Spirituality. Pastor Gray returned to the pulpit three weeks after his spine surgery. Thanks to Pastor Elvis for his pulpit supply. The 3Gs Fellowship for all adults meets the 3rd Saturday of each month, including July and August. We rescheduled our Vacation Bible School program for later in the year. We continue to pray for our hospitalized church family members. We are in our second quarter of Sunday School curriculum from Answers in Genesis studying from Creation to Cain and Abel.

Calvary: Our youth hosted a Block Party. Kids came, played games, enjoyed the food and watched it rain. Vacation Bible School was held June 6-10. We had 43 children, 16 VBS adults and 20 workers. The Women's Ministry finished the Beth More study. A new study will start in September. Pastor Don gave a message to the residents at Fair View and Rest Haven Nursing Homes. Some members sang with the residents. On June 17, Trevor Thomas (Mr. Drama) presented a drama that was enjoyed by all. A Carry-In Supper was enjoyed before the program. Father's Day was a great time to honor our fathers. A gift was given to all fathers. On June 26, the choir presented a Fourth of July Celebration of music. Pastor Don preached a message with a patriotic theme. Hamburger and hot dogs and a Carry-In Lunch was offered to those in attendance. Pastor Don and Marie, Taylor and Emily represented Calvary at the Southern Baptist Convention in St. Louis.

East Sedalia: We continued to have work days removing things from the old church and education building before the demolition of both. A sale of items removed will be held on July 9. On Memorial Day, May 30, the huge old bell in the belfry rang 12 times at noon, for the last time. Several present and former members were there for that special time. It will be retained for display at a later date. Vacation Bible School was held June 5-10. A total of 115 were enrolled with an average attendance of 88. An offering of \$442.48 was received. It will be donated to "Dina's Kids," an orphanage in Haiti. In the absence of Dr. Daryl Stagg, we welcomed Rev. Gary Palmer and Rev. Jim Vest to supply for us in Sunday morning services. On Father's Day we honored the oldest father, the father with the oldest child present and the father that had taught Sunday School the longest number of years. The Pastor Search Committee conducted a Church Health Survey on Sunday, June 26.

Emmet Avenue: We had another addition by statement, a faithful visitor and we welcomed him. We will observe the Lord's Supper the first Sunday in July. We plan to have a new roof put on in July.

FBC, Sedalia: A group of senior adults traveled to the Baptist Home at Ozark, Missouri on June 2. They took several loads of needed supplies and personal items for the residents. They also went to Branson, stayed overnight, and saw "Moses" at the Sight and Sound Theater. Vacation Bible School was June 6-10. We had approximately 120 kids or so attending, and one profession of faith. On June 12, we had our annual "VBS Family Day." One was baptized on June 19. The youth group and adult sponsors went to Philadelphia June 23-July 2 for a World Changers mission trip.

Flat Creek: May 29 was the annual homecoming Memorial Day celebration with a noon fellowship dinner and an afternoon service. Justin Wright was the guest speaker. Five children and one assistant Kabin Leader attended camp June 13-17. A mission project filling meal bags for Haiti was joyously done by fifteen of us on June 11. This was a cool venture thanks to Maplewood inviting us to join them as they also did the Kids Against Hunger activity.

Katy Park: Our church set up a "Cookie Creation" booth at the Scott Joplin and Queen of the Prairie Festivals on June 4. We held our yearly Promotion Sunday for those kids moving up to new Life Groups on June 5. Our church held a work day at CASA on June 11. Our Youth Group attended Super Summer at Hannibal LaGrange June 13-17. Twelve campers and five leaders attended Children's Camp at Heit's Point Camp June 13-17. Pastor Jon was the camp pastor. We recognized fathers on Father's Day, June 19. The Senior High Life Group ministered to the residents of Fair View Nursing Home on June 26. We served a meal at the Community Café on June 23.

Lamine: Our Bar-B-Q has been changed to July 2, 2016 at 6:00 pm. The men had a good time and a good turn out for the Clay Pigeon Shoot at Jay Rice's house. A Planning Meeting was June 26th with a Carry-In Dinner. Our pastor was on vacation June 19. We had a special day for our fathers on Father's Day. Sunday School is at 9:30 am, church service is at 10:40 am. Sunday night Bible Study at 5:00 pm. Wednesday night Discipleship/Prayer Meeting at 6:00 pm.

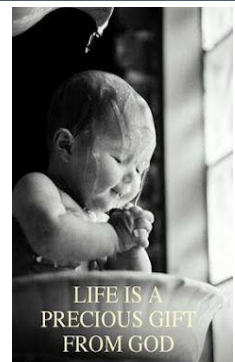
BIRTHRIGHT
