"NEWS FROM OUR CHURCHES"

Bethany: The saints at Bethany continued our summer of outreach as we partnered with Sagrada Scholarship Bible Camp, providing counselors, van drivers, leadership and campers. We also cooperated with the Open Door and neighborhood churches to host the summer lunch program at Hubbard Park. We held "Church in the Park" on Sunday evening the 17th at Liberty Park. Our Young Family group met for fellowship on the 20th. We met for our third quarter congregational meeting on the 31st. Our mission team went into high gear preparing for our early August trip to the Haiti Home of Hope Orphanage. Pastor Bowen continued his exposition of 1 John.

Broadway: In July, a long-time regular attendee requested to transfer her membership to Broadway. Our congregation is completing a Church Health Survey. We are in our second quarter of Answers in Genesis curriculum. The entire Sunday School studies the same topic at their age-appropriate level. Because of unavailability of adults (hospitalization, family emergencies), we canceled VBS. <u>On August 4, from 12:30 pm to 3:00 pm, we will have "An Afternoon With Dinosaurs" for children from age 4 to 12</u>. Through Christian videos, activities, and lessons, the children will learn that "ON DAY 6 GOD CREATED DINOSAURS - Genesis 1:24." Pastor Gray is recovering from spine surgery "on schedule" according to his surgeon but has developed fluid on his lungs unrelated to surgery.

Calvary: Two children attended Kids Kamp. The Fourth of July Celebration was presented by the choir. Afterwards we enjoyed a Covered Dish Lunch of hamburgers and hot dogs. The Church Council had a Vision Retreat on July 16. Plans were made for future ministry. Members visited Rest Haven and Fair View Nursing Homes. We sang and Pastor Don encouraged the residents. On July 15, members and guests viewed the movie, "FAITH OF OUR FATHERS." Our youth went on a mission trip, July 17-23 to the St. Louis area. A trip to a ball game in Kansas City and a concert with Casting Crowns was a great experience for the youth and church members. The "FOUR STATES QUARTET" presented a gospel concert on July 17. Jim Edwards and our own Michael Sproles were part of the quartet. We will celebrate our 90th Anniversary with a celebration on September 25, 2016. On June 30, Jack R. Howell, a long time member and deacon, went to be with the Lord. East Sedalia: Active church members purchased memorabilia from the old church on July 8. On July 9 the church held a large public sale of items removed from the old church buildings. We were pleased to have many members and former members attend the sale. Demolition of the old church started on July 11. Some members were present to watch, take pictures, and video the proceedings. We are thankful for all the good memories we had while worshiping in the old sanctuary. We are fortunate to have a wonderful youth group. They participated in a youth retreat. The girls met in the home of Stephanie and Russell Dedrick. The boys met in the home of Kaytlyn and Jacob Bergman. It was a good time to grow closer together and to worship the Lord. The ladies held their monthly luncheon at Kehde's BBQ.

FBC. Sedalia: A group of senior adults traveled to Arrow Rock on July 7 for lunch and a showing of "1776: the Musical" at the Lyceum Theater. Kids in Kindergarten through 6th grade enjoyed a day at the Boonville Aquatic Center on July 11. They attended the presentation of "The Little Mermaid" at the Liberty Center on July 24. A large group of children went to CentriKids Camp in Bolivar, Missouri July 18-22.

<u>Katy Park</u>: The GAs went on a camping trip to Knob Noster State Park on July 6-7. We ministered to the residents of Fairview Nursing Home in a Sunday morning service on July 24. On July 30 members participated in a one-day mission trip to Marshall, Missouri, to present our "Cookie Creation" booth at their annual "Day in the Park."

Lamine: Because of the rain we rescheduled our Bar B-Que for the following weekend. We enjoyed hotdogs, hamburgers, and all the fixings. Ladies Of Lamine (L.O.L) made fans for the church. Vacation Bible School ran from July 11-15. We had lots of food, fun, and crafts, and a few dedicated adults. We had Parent's Day July 17, with a Carry In Lunch. We had a "Singspiration" on July 24.

New Hope: VBS July 11-15: 156 kids and 80 workers enrolled with a high attendance of 133 children and 75 workers. Eight children made decisions for Christ, and several more are asking questions. On VBS Family Day we had 300 in worship, with 220-230 staying for lunch and 188 at the pool party at Liberty Pool that evening. K-12th grades will promote to their new Sunday School classes on July 31. A church picnic and ice cream making contest will be held at Bothwell State Park on Sunday evening, September 4. We're gearing up for the *Showing Hope* Car & Bike Show on the church property Saturday, September 10. Motorcycles were added for judging this year. Registration fees are \$20 per car or truck and \$15 per bike. All proceeds are used to pay summer camp fees for local teens and children whose families otherwise could not afford to send their children. **Vision**: We volunteered twice at Open Door food pantry. We had our first Vacation Bible School with 20 kids and 28 adult volunteers in attendance for three nights! The men met for their monthly breakfast. We observed the Lord's Supper on the 17th. The ladies began a secret sister program on July 1 and will continue until December. The youth met a couple of times. We are collecting school supplies for C.A.C.T.U.S. We had four missionaries go to Mexico in July.
