

"NEWS FROM OUR CHURCHES"

Bethany: The saints at Bethany sent our fifth mission team to the Haiti Home of Hope orphanage since 2008. Our team did lots of light maintenance, put on a VBS, and helped in Home's community milk program (helping needy families with babies). Closer to home, we finished our first summer volunteering with the Open Door's summer lunch program. We'll share an ice cream social and missions pie auction on the evening of the 28th. It's also time to begin preparing for our 9th annual Fall Bible Conference. This year's conference falls on the last weekend of September and will feature Pastor Mike Summers, Countryside Baptist Church of Olathe, Kansas, preaching on marriage and the family.

Broadway: We are beginning the third quarter of Sunday School Curriculum from Answers in Genesis. We will schedule another "Day with Dinosaurs" for children from 4 to 12. We welcomed one new member, a young woman who has worshipped with us for over a year. Our witness to the Sedalia community includes local mission projects. We will be providing supplies for Washington School and have contacted Birthright and Safe Home for their needs. Our Fall videos include "Separation of Church and State," "What's Right With America," "End Times Prophecies," and "Protecting Life and Liberty."

<u>Calvary:</u> We received one new member by letter and one by profession of faith. The Men's Breakfast was held on Saturday, August 6, with speaker Dr. Glenn Sparks from First Baptist Church. Our <u>90th Church Anniversary is Sunday</u>, <u>September 25</u>. Sunday School is at 8:50 am followed by worship at 10:00 am with a noon meal to follow. We hope many former members will stay for the special music and hear the speakers. Pastor Don and Marie went on a mission trip to India. On Thursday, August 25, we served a meal to the Smith-Cotton football team. Our Pastor, Youth Minister, youth, and members helped at the Baptist Tent at the fairgrounds. The Women's Ministry will have two Beth Moore studies. One starts on September 13 at 9:00 am with Donna Points as leader. The evening study will begin on Thursday, September 15, at 6:00 pm with Tina Walters as leader. "Friday at the Movies" will start in October.

<u>East Sedalia:</u> We were sorry to lose Kathy Racy as our secretary, as her husband's work took them to Kansas City, MO. We are fortunate to have Vonna Hogan as our new secretary. Community Wednesday night meals are being continued for those 18 years and younger. Mission Friends are for Nursery-K, God's Kids for Grades 1-5, and The Refuge for the Youth. Adult Bible Study is held for adults. Several dozen cookies were donated for the jail ministry. Demolition of the old church and educational building is complete. We look forward to a beautiful grassy area there real soon.

Emmet Avenue: Our roof has been replaced. The men are continuing to improve some areas inside the church. We have set a goal for the Rheubin L. South Missouri Mission offering.

FBC, Sedalia: We hosted two meals for our local law enforcement officers on August 4; one from 12 to 2, and one from 4 to 6. Approximately 140 officers came and enjoyed a great meal, and received our thanks and appreciation for all that they do for us and the community. 56 people came to help pack Buddy Packs on August 8. Food bags go to children in 14 different schools in our community and the immediate surrounding area. We helped pack C.A.C.T.U.S. school supplies on August 22. One was baptized on August 7, and one on August 21.

<u>Flat Creek:</u> The evening of July 31 was most enjoyable as Honce and Betty DeHaven were celebrated for years of service as custodians. Their favorite songs were sung followed by a time of fellowship. Lake Days consisted of three days of water activity and camping plus an evening of BBQ fellowship at Truman Lake August 4-6.

Hopewell: We baptized one on August 14. Our Family Camp is September 9-11. Our <u>Annual Fish Fry is September 18</u> following services.

STATE FAIR REPORT, 2016

The Missouri State Fair has come and gone! Our Missouri DOM Fellowship did a fine job of ministering to several folks. We were able to share a personal testimony/gospel presentation at least 1206 times.

Of those 1206 registrations, 35 were recorded as making a profession of faith in Christ. Our plan is to get those names and contact information out to DOMs and churches as soon as possible. For me....one of the highlights came on Saturday afternoon. A large group of folks came in together. In that group were several Hispanic folks. They didn't speak English. They were from Guatemala. It turns out they were with a Cowboy Church. One of the group served as the translator as Mike Steinburt from Texas Association witnessed to them. Seven of the Guatemalans made a profession of faith!



We had about 157 volunteers from several associations. I say "about" because some of that 157 worked multiple shifts. We had volunteers from 20 different associations: Bethel, Spring River, Jefferson, West Central, Fellowship, Lawrence, Tri-County, Thousand Hills, North Grand River, Salt River, Mount Salem/Wyaconda, Harmony, Mid Lakes, Mid Missouri, Harrison, Heartland, Texas, Linn/Livingston, and Reynolds. Everyone who worked did a GREAT job....and I appreciate EVERYONE who helped make the fair ministry happen!

For the past seven years I have been blessed over and over again by working with this ministry. It has been a joy to see that several thousand folks have been able to hear the gospel and to see over 300 recorded professions of faith. It has been great working with so many volunteers from our associations. However, I feel it is time for someone else to become chairman of the State Fair committee. It's time for some fresh ideas and make new opportunities for ministry at the fair. Thank you for allowing me to serve as I have. My prayer is that God has used our ministry for His honor and glory.
