The Apostle Paul instructed the church to pray for leaders:

"First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth."

(1 Timothy 2:1-4)

In this passage, there is a clear calling for Christians to pray for kings and all people in high positions. Notice that Paul doesn't qualify his statement with "if only those leaders are [fill in the blank]." That means we pray for our President and all governing officials regardless of their political ideology or conviction.



Lottie Moon – China (1840-1912)



- * Raised near Roanoke, VA
- * Appointed first single female missionary by SBC
- Spent 40 years in China as teacher to children and evangelist to
- Challenged SBC women to form their own missionary organization for support and promotion of missions
- Encouraged an annual Christmas offering for foreign missions in 1888 (an offering later took her name)
- Her approach was different: "It is comparatively easy to give oneself to mission work ... but it is not easy to give oneself to an alien people. Yet the latter is much better and truer work than the former."
- She advocated regular furloughs
- During a national famine she succumbed to malnutrition, dying en route to the US for health reasons.
