

#### "NEWS FROM OUR CHURCHES"

Bethany: The saints at Bethany began the season by pulling a float in the Sedalia Christmas Parade on the 3rd and then observing a Christmas Missions service and fellowship on the 4th. Our ladies enjoyed an evening out at Colton's and our men gathered for breakfast and Bible study. Our deacon team and their wives enjoyed dinner and fellowship on the 17th, hosted by Craig and Joanie. We enjoyed a Christmas music program on the 18th and plan to carol for our widows and home-bound on the 21st. We will celebrate our annual Christmas Eve Candlelight service on the 24th at 5:00 p.m. and gather on Christmas morning for a 10:30 service (no Sunday School). Pastor Bowen has been exploring the coming of the Messiah from the Psalms and the direct connection between the Christmas Story and the Gospel Story in Paul's Epistles.

Bethlehem: In November, we gathered turkeys and sides for three families in the area and the women's group added an additional one. The families were thankful. We collected items for Christmas baskets. In November, we practiced for our adult cantata and children's play. Both were wonderful. There is nothing more precious than hearing the story of Jesus through a child. The kids and adults shared homemade cookies and drinks after the play. Christmas is on Sunday this year and we cannot wait for Christmas day, not for the gifts, but to sit in church with our church family singing to Jesus.

Broadway: In December, we welcomed three new members. Two were invited by friend or family who had placed them on our prayer list. One had accepted Christ earlier in life but had not been baptized--and so on December 11, the same day as our celebration of the Lord's Supper, she was baptized. The church family fellowshipped together for a Christmas meal. Our church-wide Sunday School lessons find us chronologically in the life of Jacob, his meeting with the Lord who changed his name to Israel and revealed Himself as the LADDER between sinful man and eternal life. We light Advent candles, and more at a candlelight service Christmas Eve remembering Christ as the Light of the world. We continue our Sunday evening studies on Discipleship and Worldview.

<u>Calvary</u>: The men and boys had their regular monthly breakfast with a guest speaker. December 4-10 was the Week of Prayer for International Missions. Our church gave to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. The ladies had a salad luncheon. The new Bible Study will begin Tuesday, January 24, with Beth Moore's "Why Godly People Do Ungodly Things." On December 11, our choir presented "Christmas Celebration." Our Business Meeting was Wednesday, December 14, with new budget for 2017. We made visits to Fair View Nursing Home and Sylvia Thompson Residence Center. On December 18, members went Christmas caroling and returned to the church for a birthday party for Jesus. Our annual Christmas Eve Candlelight Service is at 5:00 pm. On Christmas Day, we will not have Sunday School, but will worship at 10:00 am.

East Sedalia: The Outreach Committee held an activity for the church and the neighborhood by making Christmas wreaths. Members donated many things for the activity. People made their own wreath to take home. It was well attended and many beautiful wreaths were made. The ladies luncheon was held at Little Big Horn on Thursday, December 15. The youth made and donated cookies to show their appreciation for the police and fire departments. The youth went Christmas caroling. They also helped the flower committee put up Christmas decorations.

Emmet Avenue: Our church filled 62 shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child. Our worship service on Christmas day is at 10:00 am. Christmas baskets were delivered to the shut-ins of the church. The men have done a great job on all the recent remodeling, inside and outside of the church. On January 1,we will observe the Lord's Supper and January 29 we will have our 5th Sunday Fellowship Dinner following the morning worship service.

FBC, Sedalia: We hosted a Christmas concert by The Ball Brothers on November 18. November 27 was our annual "Hanging of the Green" service, followed by a church soup supper. A group of our senior adults went to FBC, Raytown on December 3 to see the Christmas pageant. 150 gift bags, filled with gloves, hats, an orange and a candy cane, were delivered to Forest Avenue Family Shelter in Kansas City on December 8. We also gave out 50 toys to residents. The Women's Enrichment Ministry hosted a special night for women on December 9, called "The Gift." Our music ministry presented the musical "Almost There" on December 11. We had a church-wide caroling event on December 21, with hot chocolate, coffee and cookies afterwards. Our Christmas Eve Candlelight Lord's Supper service will be at 5:30 pm. Our Christmas Day service will be at 10:45 (no 8:15 am and no Sunday School).

Flat Creek: We provided a meal for the Community Cafe on November 29 and took over 5,000 cans of food to Open Door during November and December. Our Candlelight Christmas Eve program was a meaningful experience as we celebrated our Savior's birth. Our Lottie Moon Christmas offering was surpassed as we supported our IMB missionaries in prayer and giving.
