





"NEWS FROM OUR CHURCHES"

Bethany: We hosted the Spencer Family Music Ministry for a morning of special music on the 8th. We enjoyed an autumn "Church in the Park" at Liberty Park featuring fellowship, food, music and outreach on the 22nd. The Ladies' Fellowship shared an Italian dinner on the 26th and the Men's Morning Fellowship met for breakfast and Bible study on the 28th. Our fourth quarter congregational meeting is scheduled for the evening of the 29th. We'll also collect canned goods for the Open Door that day. Pastor Bowen continues to preach though Ephesians on Sunday mornings and 1 Peter on Sunday evenings, with a recent emphasis on the filling of the Holy Spirit. **Bethlehem:** Hello from Bethlehem Baptist Church! We had a wonderful time at the fall spaghetti dinner and silent auction. We fed the football players at Smith Cotton for the pasta feed. We have seven new members this month, one marriage, one baby dedication and one salvation! God is good! Our upcoming events are a First Responders Fellowship on November 2nd at 7 pm. Everyone is welcome to fellowship and a pot luck dinner following. We are working hard on our Christmas programs for adults and the children.
