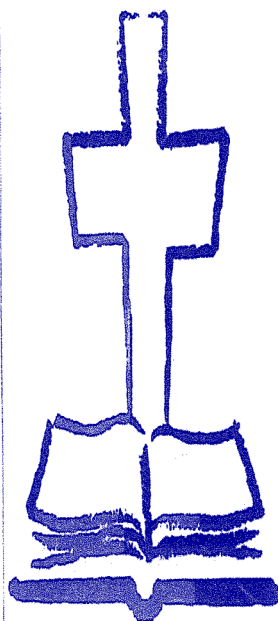

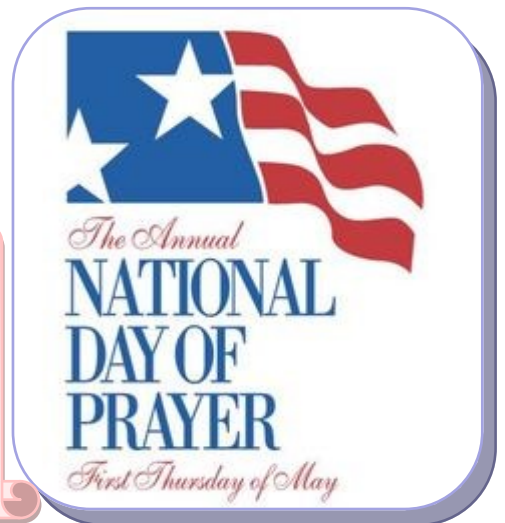

“NEWS FROM OUR CHURCHES”

Antioch: We have good attendance for our Services. Easter Sunday was a blessing as we gathered at the foot of the cross for our sunrise service.
