"NEWS FROM OUR CHURCHES"

Bethany: The saints at Bethany began July in song, with our second Summer Hymn Sing on July 5. We enjoyed a Family Movie Night on the 10th, featuring the Christian film "Courageous." Several of our members served disadvantaged children in our community and area through the Sagrada Scholarship Bible Camp near Lincoln. We met for our 3rd Quarter Congregational Business Meeting on the 26th. We served at the Community Café on the 30th. Pastor Bowen continued his summer sermon mini-series exploring the "One Anothers" of the New Testament on Sunday mornings and preached on "Rekindling Your Passion for Christ" on Sunday evenings.

Bethlehem: We baptized one on June 21.

Broadway: VBS found 16 explorers "Hiking through History" on an adventure from Answers in Genesis. They followed a path designed by Debbie, Mary, and Lora and learned "The 7 Cs of History": Creation, Corruption (the Fall), Catastrophe (the Flood), Confusion, (the Tower of Babel), and God's Plan of Salvation (Christ, the Cross, and Consummation). John, Bert, Maxine, and Cynthia helped construct and assemble areas for each "C." A shepherd and a soldier, Noah, and Adam and Eve (Bob, Jerry, Murica, Ron, Darryl, Omar, and Pastor Gray) presented Biblical lessons. Hikers made their own hiking vests and other projects. Families came Friday evening for a meal prepared by Marge and Opal, and VBS was Saturday. East Sedalia: The women provided cookies for the Jail Ministry in June and July. On July 12, Rev. Jim Vest held a Commissioning Service for the eleven youth and five leaders to Falls Creek Camp on July 13. The leaders who were going were: Kelley and David G. Bergman, Jeanie and David L. Bergman and Stephanie Dedrick. On July 22, the youth gave testimonies about their experiences at camp. We lost a long time member, Don McFarland. He was 101 1/2 years old. Funeral services were held on July 13. A ladies luncheon was held at Kehde's Barbeque on July 23 at noon.

FBC, Sedalia: Sixteen youth and eight adults traveled to World Changers in Shreveport, Louisiana July 2-11. They scraped and repainted houses and built a deck. Three young men from the area were baptized while they were there. Twenty-six kids and six leaders went to CentriKids Camp at Bolivar July 13-17, and had a great experience. Four adults will attend the SEND North America Conference in Nashville August 2-5. The Illinois All-State Youth Choir presented a concert at FBC on July 23.

<u>Flat Creek:</u> We served a meal at the Community Cafe on July 3rd. July 4th was celebrated by a fellowship gathering with a meal, visiting, and then watching a beautiful fireworks display together. An eager group of children enjoyed the week of VBS which ended Friday evening with a program for parents and friends at Liberty Park followed by swimming at the pool.

The young people had a week of activities at the church June 28 -July 5. The teenagers attended camp at Windermere.

<u>Providence</u>: Blessings abound! God graciously blessed our youth events this month. A registration, block, and pizza party was held on Sunday, July 12. Thirty youth were enrolled for VBS. Many parents and friends attended as well. We are nearing completion of our new combination volleyball and basketball court. Many thanks to the wonderful folks at Providence for their prayers, faith, and service as we continue to seek God's grace and leadership in every part of our ministry. God loves a cheerful giver and we praise Him for willing hearts.

<u>Vision</u>: We served at the Open Door food pantry twice this month. A small group of men helped a church member's family move. We had our Quarterly Business Meeting. The men met for their monthly breakfast with six in attendance. We had four baptisms at Pastor Dave's house with a BBQ to follow. Three members from our church went to Nurio, Mexico. One family participated in the Kids Across America overnight stay in Golden, MO. The youth met two times this month at the Hague's. Several HBA churches and members worked together to repair a kitchen that caught fire.
